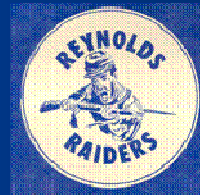
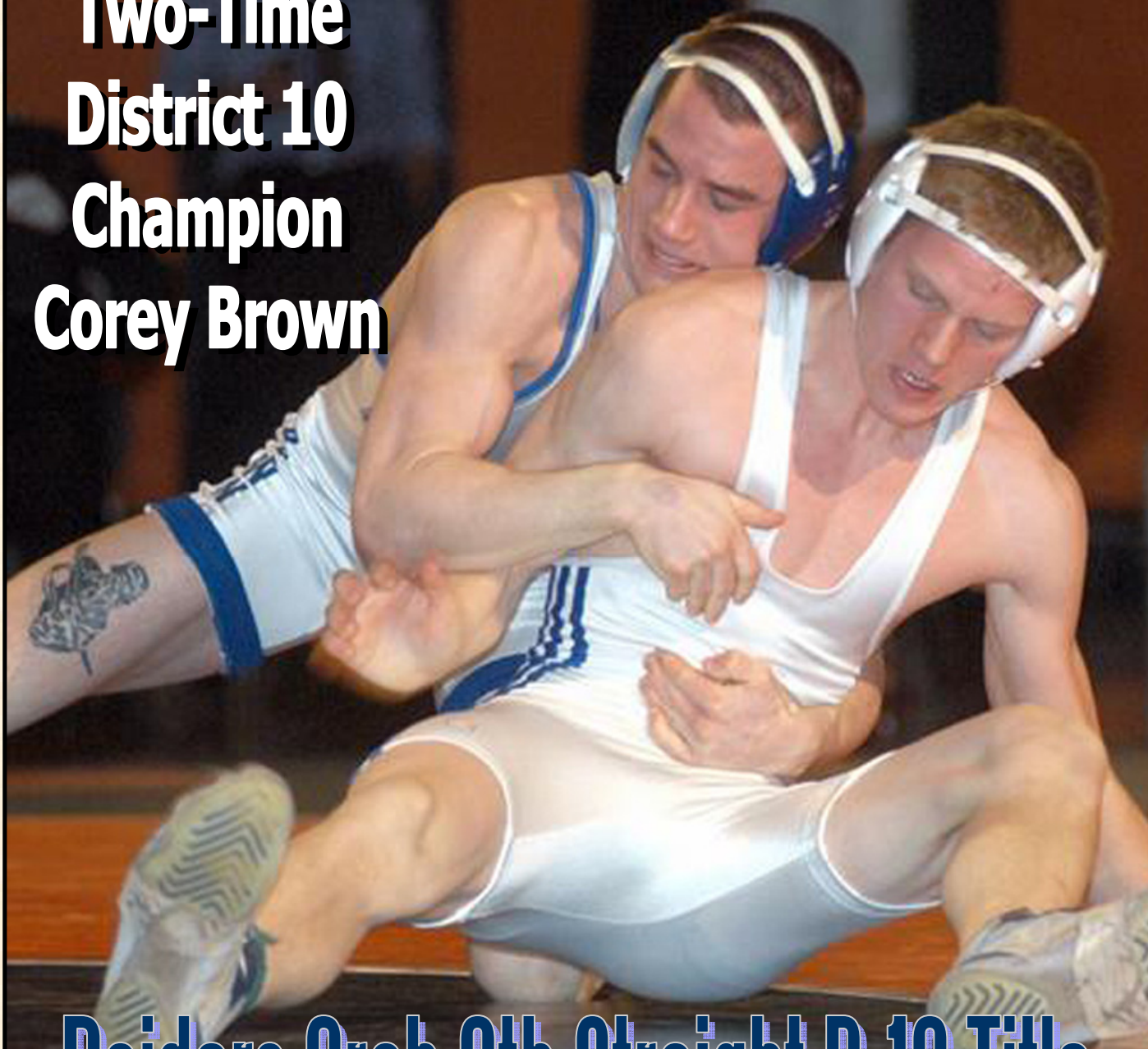

Raiders Grab 8th Straight D-10 Title

Four Straight Duals Medals - A Sweet Accomplishment

There is little doubt as to what the No. 1 tourist destination is for wrestling fans living in the Reynolds School District – it's Hershey. Over the last decade, the annual trip to Hershey has turned into a bi-annual pilgrimage for many Raider fans. The last four years, in particular, it's been a great ride.

This year's team, in many ways an unknown entity when the season began, brought home a bronze medal from the state dual match championships. Though the color of the medal was a bit different than the one they were reaching for, it's still a pretty sweet accomplishment.

After beating Commodore Perry and Harborcreek in the District 10 tournament, the Raiders advanced to Hershey where they posted a 3-1 overall record. Their only loss, to eventual state champion Burrell, was by a razor-thin 24-22 margin. That semifinal round loss snapped the Raiders' win streak at 54 straight.

"It seems like as the season went on, we had to keep re-adjusting our goals because of the way this team was performing," said head coach Brian Hills.

"In many ways, I think these kids exceeded our expectations," Hills added. "I couldn't be more proud of everything they accomplished."

Of course, Hills will continue to re-adjust his team's goals as his wrestlers head back down the road to Hershey for individual states.

Through the District 10

Championships, 10 Raiders are still in the hunt for a return trip to Hershey. Of the 10, only two-time placewinner Cody Kelly is a returning qualifier.

NUMBERS & NOTES—By virtue of a 19-1 dual-match season, Brian Hills improves his overall coaching record to 310-33-1.

In the history of the program, Reynolds can now boast of a 622-71-2 overall record.

Though the Raiders saw their winning streak halted at 54 straight, the team still has a regular season win streak of 73 straight that will pick up at the beginning of next season.

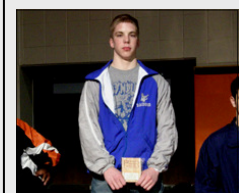
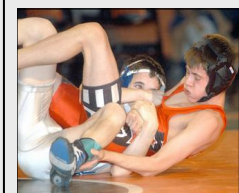
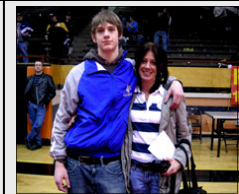

Raiders Place 3rd at State Duals

The Reynolds Raiders capped a 19-1 dual match season by placing third at the state duals tournament.

It marks the fourth straight season that the Raiders have returned home from Hershey as one of the top three teams in the state.

In the last four state duals tournaments, the Raiders have placed second, first, first and third, respectively.

In the opening round at Hershey, the Raiders topped Brandywine Heights by a score of 42-21.

In the semifinals, the Raiders were edged by eventual champion Burrell, 24-22, before bouncing back with wins over Northwestern Lehigh, 47-21, and Shady-side Academy, 34-25. In

all, the Raiders posted a 3-1 mark in Hershey.

For the record, it was Burrell (21-0) that snapped the Raiders' 54-match win streak in an epic semifinal battle. The match featured seven lead changes and bonus points in only two of 14 weight classes (both by the Raiders).

"When you keep winning, you don't want it to end. But, we lost to a very good team. We said before the tournament that match would probably determine the championship. I'm still very proud of our kids. As I said before, at the start of the year we didn't even know if we would

make it back down here, and we made the medal round," said coach Brian Hills, who now owns a career record of 310-33-1.

Senior Corey Brown picked up career win No. 100 while in Hershey and was one of three Raiders to post 4-0 records. Cody Kelly and Will Ringer also won four times, while Luke Taylor was 3-1.

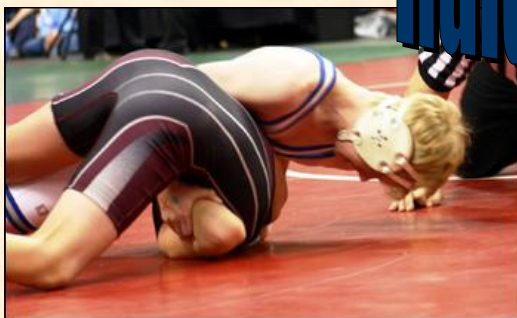

What's It Mean To Be a Teammate?

If the Cowardly Lion and the Tin Man are still wondering around somewhere looking for a some courage and a heart, maybe someone should steer them in the direction of Reynolds junior Sam Fuchs.

The Scarecrow? Well, maybe Fuchs wouldn't be the best choice.

For much of the year, Fuchs was the Raiders' man behind the curtain – training, watching his weight and mentally preparing for the day when he could help his team make another run at a state duals title. Because of a knee injury, Fuchs knew he would likely not wrestle competitively until at least the middle of January. Undaunted, he spent the entire season preparing for what turned out to be a total of six matches.

"Sam knew that there was a hole in the lineup where he could step in and help us. He wanted to be part of another state championship run," said coach Brian Hills. "This is a decision that Sam and his family made together. Sam was never concerned with the individual tournaments. Pretty much from the onset, it was all

about the state duals and the team tournament."

So, what was the real benefit of having Fuchs available?

"We were a better team with Sam in the lineup," Hills said. "There's no doubt about that."

Fuchs' return would not have been possible had junior Cody Kelly not been willing to make a big sacrifice, as well.

Kelly, in fact, had already made up his mind to stay at 125 pounds for the postseason when the picture began to clear that Fuchs would be able to get to 125 (his certified weight). Like Fuchs, Kelly put his personal ambitions on hold in an effort to help the overall balance and strength of the team.

"Cody made a big sacrifice too, because he had to follow the weight loss plan that allowed him to get to 119," Hills said. "That

takes a lot of discipline."

The fact that Reynolds ultimately lost to Burrell 24-22 in the state semifinals does not diminish the sacrifice these two wrestlers made for their team. In fact, Hills is hoping it may have helped stoke a fire that will continue to burn for another 12 months.

"The best thing about this whole situation is that Sam is a junior and he'll get another shot at it," Hills said. "He knows he has until the middle of November (2008) to get healthy and come back strong for his senior year."

"Knowing him, and knowing what he did this year, I fully expect Sam to be back next year full of the desire and the fire to help get this team back down to Hershey again," Hills said. "I couldn't be more proud of what Sam and Cody did. I think it says a lot about the kind of kids they really are."

Miller Qualifies for D-III Nationals

Robbie Miller, a 2007 Reynolds High School graduate, has qualified for the NCAA Division III National Wrestling Championships by virtue of his second place finish at his regional qualifier held recently at Wabash College.

Miller, a true freshman, posted a 4-1 mark at the qualifier and improved his overall season record to 28-5. Three of

his four victories at the qualifier were by fall.

At Reynolds, Miller posted 50 wins his senior season and placed fifth at the PIAA Championships at 125 pounds.

The Division III national championship tournament will be hosted by Coe College (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) and will begin on Friday, March 7.

Junior Cody Kelly (125) and senior Corey Brown (130) both won their second District 10 titles and freshman Mason Beckman earned his first as the Reynolds Raiders scored 171.5 team points to easily outdistance a competitive field and win its 8th straight D-10 team points championship.

In all, 10 Raiders earned the right to advance to the Northwest Regional.

Along with the champions, Will Ringer (215) placed second and Adam Matthews (112) and

were fifth.

"I couldn't be more pleased with the performance of our team this year," said Reynolds coach Brian Hills. "This year when the season started I think a lot of teams felt they might have a shot at (a D-10 title). So I have to give a lot of credit to our young kids who stepped up.

"We had some ups and downs here, but we're taking 10 kids to regions. We'll go back and get ready for next week," Hills said.

Junior Kaine Kulka (145), sophomore Gregg Baptiste (160) and senior Corey Shields (285) also wrestled at the tourney, but did not advance.

Raiders Storm Through Sections

Champs Beckman, Kelly, Brown & Miller Lead Posse of 13 D-10 Qualifiers

Senior Corey Brown became a rare three-time Section champion as the Reynolds Raiders cruised to their 13th straight Section team championship.

Brown won his title at 130 pounds and was joined in the winner's circle by freshman Mason Beckman (103), junior Cody Kelly (125) and senior Mike Miller (189). It was the second title for Kelly and the first for Beckman and Miller.

"Winning three championships is a great accomplishment. Corey is our captain and just a great all-around kid, a true student-athlete and our leader," said coach Brian Hills. "He finished fourth at regions the last two years, one match from state, so he really has his goals set high this season."

The Raiders accumulated 249.5 team points to easily outdistance runner-up Greenville (183) and third-place finisher Commodore Perry (177).

In all, 13 Raiders earned the right

to advance to the District 10 championships.

Will Ringer placed second at 215 pounds while Adam Matthews (112), Tony D'Urso (135), Kaine Kulka (145), Brandon Maun (152), Gregg Baptiste (160) and Ryan Dawes (171) all placed third. Luke Taylor was fourth at 140 pounds and Corey Shields (285) ended fifth.

The other Reynolds wrestler entered in the tournament was freshman Eddy Nottingham, who posted a 1-2 record at 119 pounds.

"We had a tough round in the semis, but when you have 13 guys going in, you're going against the best from all the other teams," said Hills. "But I didn't like the way we wrestled. We were flat. I don't know if it was a carryover from the state duals or what. We had a little team talk and the kids came out in the consolations and wrestled very well."

Brown Becomes 24th Member of 100-Win Club

Senior team captain Corey Brown has become the 24th Reynolds High School wrestler to reach the 100-win plateau.

Brown reached 100 wins at the state duals tournament in Hershey, in the Raiders' consolation finals win over Shadyside Academy.

For Brown, win No. 100 came in style as he scored a 15-5 major decision over Matt Geil. He boasted a perfect 4-0 record in Hershey.

Brown reaching 100 career wins

becomes even more impressive when you consider that he won only nine varsity matches as a freshman.

Through the end of the District 10 championships, Brown had not lost to a Class AA wrestler all season.

Senior Mike Miller and junior Cody Kelly also reached 100 wins this season.

The next Raider in line to reach 100 wins is likely junior Will Ringer, who ended the regular season with 81.

5 Raiders Win Crowns at JV Tourney

With five individual champions, the Reynolds Raiders were well represented at the Northwest PA Junior Varsity wrestling tournament which took place Feb. 2 at Jamestown High School.

This was the final competition of the year for junior varsity wrestlers. Since there is no official District wide junior varsity tournament, this is considered by many as the unofficial D-10 junior varsity championships. There were nearly 20 D-10 schools represented, including both Class AA and AAA squads.

Of 10 Raider wrestlers entered in the tournament, seven placed in the top three of their respective weight classes—including the

five champs.

Eddy Nottingham (112), Dillon Babcock (125), Zeke Ohl (152), Tyler Rhoades (171) and Cory Augustine (215) all finished first, while Charlie Murray (145) finished second and Jeremy Fowler (160) was third.

Babcock, Ohl, Rhoades and Augustine all posted 3-0 records, and Nottingham was 2-0. Fowler was 3-1 and Murray went 1-1.

Babcock, Rhoades and Augustine all completed their 2007-08 junior varsity seasons with undefeated records.

AJ Allen (135, 2-2 record), Tom Gilson (171, 0-2) and Robbie McCollum (189, 2-2) were the other Raiders who took part in the tournament.

Drew Named Section 2 Coach of the Year

Reynolds Grad Leads CP to 20-6 Record, 1st Duals Appearance



Kevin Drew, head wrestling coach at Commodore Perry High School and a 1993 RHS grad, was recently named the 2007-08 District 10 Section 2 Coach of the Year.

Drew guided his squad to a 20-6 overall record and the Panthers qualified for the District 10 Class AA duals for the first time in school history, posting a 1-1 mark.

Drew expects the Panthers to be strong again next season, as his team graduates just one senior that was a full-time starter.

While at RHS, Drew compiled an 89-21-3 overall record and was a PIAA Class AA runner-up his junior year at 189 pounds.

As a senior, he had a perfect 12-0 record and had just won a Mannheim tournament championship when an automobile accident ended his scholastic career.

Despite a shattered thigh bone, Drew diligently worked his way back into form and became a NCAA Division I National Qualifier at Lock Haven University.

stands at 36-22.

As a team, Columbia is 7-7 overall and 3-2 in the Ivy League. The Lions are assured of at least a third place finish in their conference.

Dunn was a two-time state champion at RHS and is tied for first place on the all-time RHS win list with 176. Sommerfeld was a state runner-up his senior season and had 117 career high school wins.
