

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week One

The YAIAA's Mustangs of South Western were upended by the Mid-Penn's Warriors of Gettysburg 20-13. R. J. VanBrakle led the Warriors rushing attack with 13 carries for 59-yards, including a 37-yard touchdown. The Warriors "stormed" back from a 10-0 deficit in the third quarter as quarterback Evan Lewis completed 7 passes for 165-yards, 4 of which went to his favorite receiver Storm Woerner for 136-yards, including touchdowns of 62 and 49-yards. Tim Smith led the Mustangs rushing attack with 16 carries for 98-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Eric Updegrove with 10 for 63-yards, Aaron Repman with 10 for 31-yards, J. C. Laughlin with 8 for 13-yards and Jason Gigous with 5 for a yard. J. C. Laughlin complete 5 passes for 43 yards for the Mustangs, to Aaron Repman, Tim Smith, Drew Snyder, Eric Updegrove and Kory Yelton (who caught a 22-yarder that kept a drive alive for a field goal. Senior kicking sensation Drew Snyder connected on field goals of 50 and 28-yards, setting a new school record for distance and a new school record for number of field goals in a career with 14 for the Mustangs.

The YAIAA's Division II Bulldogs of West York upended the Division I Panthers of Central York 20-14. Tyler Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 41-yards. Quarterback Rob Estep passed for 159-yards, including touchdowns of 8 and 5-yards to Real (who caught 5 passes for 30-yards), 3 passes for 72-yards to Josh Koht and 4 passes for 54-yards to Zack Snellbaker. Estep also scored on a 1-yard run. Ryan Brunner led the Panthers with 59-yards rushing, followed by Tyler Grey with 17-yards. Panthers Quarterback Mike Shope, filling in for senior Nate Petry, completed 6 passes for 160-yards, including a 5-yard touchdown to Ryan Rabuck (who caught 4 passes for 66-yards), a 78-yard pass to LeRoy Calhoun and a 16-yarder to Andrew Tuleya.

The YAIAA's Bearcats of York High (William Penn) shutout the Lancaster Lebanon League's Knights of Reading 6-0 in overtime. Randale Preston led the Bearcats rushing attack with 98-yards, including a 1-yard touchdown for the only score of the game. The Knights were held to 56-yards rushing and 13-yards passing for the game.

The Mid-Penn Keystone Division Patriots of Red Land shutout the YAIAA's Wildcats of Dallastown 12-0. Matt Cox, the third brother to star for the Patriots, rushed for 202-yards, including touchdowns of 12 and 1-yards for the only scores in the game. He accounted for all but 25-yards of the positive rushing yards, which netted 184-yards because of 43-yards in losses. Skyler Hunt completed 1 pass for 9-yards to Ryan Dill for the Patriots and Cullen Dougherty the defense with 9 tackles. The stymied Wildcats managed a net total of only 14-yards rushing and 10-yards passing for the game.

The YAIAA's Division I Colonials of New Oxford shutout the Division III Thunderbolts of Littlestown 34-0. Adam Smith led the Colonials rushing attack with 166-yards, including touchdown runs of 3, 64 and 10-yards, followed by twin brother Alex Smith with 64-yards. Quarterback Alex also passed for 57-yards, including a 7-yard touchdown to Kody Kibler and 3 passes for 39-yards to Erik Harris. Ross Hall scored the final touchdown on a 13-yard run near

the end of the game. Brian Zelanko led the Thunderbolts with 49-yards rushing, followed by quarterback Luke Reichart with 37-yards. The Thunderbolts were held to 106-yards rushing and minus 6-yards passing for the game.

The YAIAA's Division I Lions of Red Lion bested the Division II Rams of Kennard-Dale 23-14. Joe Doyle rushed for 168-yards, including a 7-yard touchdown, Zac Pasco followed with 30-yards and Brett Fishel rushed for 17-yards, including a 4-yard touchdown, for the Lions. Taylor Gunder passed for 67-yards, including a 20-yard touchdown to Trent Thomas, and Ethan Becker kicked a 25-yard field goal for the Lions. Justin Boland led the Rams rushing attack with 67-yards, followed by Brandon Marousek with 48-yards. Boland also passed for 120-yards, including touchdowns of 33-yards to Kyle West and 5-yards to Josh Hare (who caught 3 passes for 26-yards). Marousek caught 3 passes for 35-yards and Mike Chenoweth caught 3 for 26-yards.

The YAIAA's Division II Warriors of Susquehannock defeated the Division I Rockets of Spring Grove 47-12, despite the fact that senior Chaz Powell, verbally committed to Penn State, left the game in the first quarter with an injury. Junior Michael Kelley led the Warriors with 66-yards rushing, followed by Powell's 56-yards and Dustin Conner's 42. Conner, Matt Duncan, Kelley, Jordan Robertson and Josh Heyne scored rushing touchdowns. Heyne passed for 123-yards, including touchdowns of 31-yards to Corey Shelton and 8-yards to George Kerr, who led the receivers with 3 receptions for 41-yards. The Rockets had minus 1-yard rushing for the game. Sophomore quarterback Ian Smith completed 4 passes for 99-yards, including a 64-yard touchdown to Randy Richardson. Matt Duncan scored on a one yard run for the Rockets.

The YAIAA's Golden Knights of Eastern York were beaten 41-14 by the Lancaster Lebanon League's Crimson Tide of Columbia. Damian Seals led the Crimson Tide rushing attack with 212-yards, including touchdowns of 2, 12, 9 and 73-yards, followed by Ben Guiles followed with 137-yards, including touchdowns of 59 and 5-yards. Mike Craft passed for 133-yards, including touchdowns of 15-yards to Joe Giandalia and 20-yards to Nicko Karanicolas, for the Golden Knights.

The YAIAA's Eagles of Dover were defeated 20-13 by the Blackhawks of Susquenita. Tim Wagner led the Blackhawks rushing attack with 66-yards, including a 7-yard touchdown, followed by Jordan Laird with 35-yards, including a 11-yard touchdown, and Michael Kell with 32-yards. Wagner also passed for 84-yards including an 8-yard touchdown to Dan Weldon (who caught 3 passes for 56-yards). Vaughn Hebron rushed for 99-yards for the Eagles, followed by Ben Delp with a net of 43-yards, including a 45-yard touchdown, and Tim Mannino with 43 yards. Colt Zarilla passed for 57-yards, including a 41-yard touchdown to Delp (who also intercepted a pass) for the Eagles. The Eagles lost 5 fumbles, including 2 punt returns, and suffered 2 interceptions.

The YAIAA's Division II Trojans of York Suburban were defeated 13-7 by the Mid-Penn's Greyhounds of Shippensburg. Blake Clawson led the Greyhounds with 52-yards rushing, including an 8-yard touchdown, followed by John Kerr with 25-yards. Craig Van Scyoc passed for 87-yards, including a 17-yard touchdown to Mark Heefner, and 2 passes for 63-yards to Loren Horst, for the Greyhounds. Brandon Snyder rushed for 145-yards for the Trojans,

followed by Lucas Houghtalling with 24-yards and Robert Kucherich with 19. Joseph Merkle passed for 27-yards, including a 2-yard touchdown to Bryce Wagner, for the Trojans.

The YAIAA's Division III Squires of Delone Catholic shutout the Division II Fighting Irish of York Catholic 7-0. Brayden Daigle intercepted an Irish pass on the first play of the game and the Squires cashed in on a 31-yard drive that led to a 7-yard touchdown run by Luke Smith at 8:45 in the first quarter. York Catholic's Andrew Bernhard avoided several tackles and broke off a 55-yard run, only to be stopped by Rob McMaster's touchdown-saving ankle tackle at the Squires' 23-yard line and Seth Hake intercepted a Squires pass and returned it 63-yards but the drive fizzled. Smith led the Squires with 74-yards rushing, followed by Michael Kale with 68-yards. Scott Lehman passed for 77-yards for the Squires and Christopher Burton countered with 81-yards for the Fighting Irish.

The YAIAA's Division III Eagles of Bermudian Springs were beaten 32-6 by the Mid-Penn's Polar Bears of Northern York. Gerald Anderson led the Polar Bears with 88-yards rushing, including touchdowns of 1 and 5-yards, followed by Chad Halterman with 48-yards, including touchdowns of 1 and 3-yards. Halterman also passed for 170-yards, including a touchdown of 15-yards to Donnie Bell (who caught 2 passes for 50-yards), and 5 passes for 79-yards to Ryan Stephenson. Ryan Spahr led the Eagles meager rushing attack with 32-yards and Tyler Deputy passed for 47-yards as the Eagles were held to 118-yards total offense.

The YAIAA's Division III Cannons of Biglerville were beaten 28-6 by the Tornadoes of Mount Carmel. James Haynes led the Red Tornadoes rushing attack with 75-yards, including an 8-yard touchdown, followed by Mike Kogut with 53-yards, including a 13-yard touchdown, Dave DeMarco with 48-yards, Jake Shinskie with 43-yards, and Julius Demetrius with 39-yards, including a 34-yard touchdown, as they rolled up 269-yards rushing. Marcus Wasilewski passed for 42-yards, including a 24-yard touchdown to Kogut, for the Red Tornadoes. Nate Witherow led the Cannons with 43-yards rushing, followed by Ryan Wagaman with 28-yards, including a 14-yard touchdown jaunt on the final play of the game to avoid a shutout. Wagaman also passed for 44-yards, including a 39-yarder to Zach Lieberum.

The YAIAA's Division III Nighthawks of Hanover fell to the Division III Raiders of Eastern Lebanon County (ELCO) 13-6. The Raiders had 3 first and goal situations in the first half and lost fumbles on the 16, 1 and 5-yard lines of the Nighthawks, but came back from a 6-0 halftime deficit. A.J. Carpenter led the Raiders with 100-yards rushing, including a 14-yard touchdown, followed by Benjamin Arnold with 61-yards and quarterback Kyle Klingaman with 52-yards, including a 1-yard touchdown. Klingaman also passed for 88-yards. Nic Shirey led the Nighthawks meager rushing attack with 13-yards, including a 4-yard touchdown, followed by James Leedy with 13 and Chris Tarbart with 11. Shirey also passed for 125-yards, including 61-yards to Marty Kefauver and 59-yards to Tyler Mackley.

The YAIAA's Spartans of York County Tech blasted the All American League's Warriors of Carson Long Military Institute 63-7. Senior Bruce Kessler ran for 2 touchdowns, of 4 and 5-yards; Antonio Harris rushed for 106-yards, including a 71-yard touchdown; Elijah Porcher scored on runs of 15 and 7-yards; Dontrell Carroll scored on a 43-yard run; A. J. Jamison scored on a 13-yard run and Angel Rodriguez scored on a 33-yard run for the Spartans. Quarterback

Kessler also threw a 58-yard touchdown pass to Dwayne Lydner. The Spartans never punted in the game. Segun Mallord threw a 63-yard touchdown pass to Alex Koff for the Warriors to avoid a shutout.

The game between the YAIAA's Division III Knights of Fairfield and the Spartans of Bishop Walsh of Cumberland, MD was postponed until November 10 at 4PM.
