

# ***District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties - Week Two***

The YAIAA's Division I Mustangs of South Western galloped over the Division II Warriors of Susquehannock 37-0. Eric Updegrove led the Mustangs with 91-yards rushing, including a 48-yard touchdown, followed by Donnie Brady with 39-yards, including touchdowns of 4 and 15-yards, Jason Gigous with 34-yards, and J. C. Laughlin with 33-yards, including a 19-yard touchdown. Lineman Chris Wilson recorded a safety, Jesse Smith blocked 2 punts, recovering one in the end zone for a Mustangs touchdown, and old reliable Drew Snyder kicked a 29-yard field goal (set up by a 59-yard kickoff return by Gigous), his school record setting 15th of his career, for the Mustangs. Dan Dixon led the Warriors meager rushing attack with 15-yards, followed by Mike Kelly with 10, as they were held to a net of minus 12-yards rushing for the game. Josh Heyne passed for 61-yards and Patrick Miller passed for 41-yards for the Warriors. Kelly led the Warriors receivers with 3 catches for 20-yards, followed by Dustin Connor with 3 for 19, Billy Kehr with 1 for 19, Aaron Hansen with 1 for 18, Dixon with 2 for 17, and Corey Shelton with 1 for 9-yards.

The Mid-Penn's Polar Bears of Northern York bested the YAIAA's Division I Panthers of Central York 28-22. Gerald Anderson rushed for 94-yards, including touchdowns of 63 and 3-yards and quarterback Chad Halterman rushed for 88-yards, including a one yard touchdown, and passed for 46-yards, including a 9-yard touchdown to Ryan Stephenson, for the Polar Bears. Tyler Gray rushed for 93-yards, including touchdowns of 14 and 15-yards, and Nate Petry passed for 73-yards, including a 12-yard touchdown to Ryan Brunner, for the Panthers.

The YAIAA's Bearcats of York High (William Penn) were blasted by the Lancaster Lebanon League's Red Tornados of J. P. McCaskey 31-14. Cousins Damar and Jerome LaRue did much of the damage for the Red Tornados. Damar caught 7 passes for 156-yards, including a 12-yard touchdown from quarterback Jared Johns (who passed for 211-yards) and 44-yards from Jerome LaRue after a pitchout from Johns. Jerome also led the rushing attack with 56-yards, followed by Johns with 37, and caught 3 passes for 51-yards. Aaron Canestrare returned an interception 36-yards for a touchdown, Lynn Anderson scored on a 17-yard run and Joseph Bunting closed out the scoring with a 23-yard field goal for the Red Tornados. Zane Woodard led the Bearcats rushing attack with 99-yards, followed by Randale Preston with 38-yards, and Mike Kinard scored on a 20-yard run. Malik Generette passed for 95-yards, including a 20-yard touchdown to Preston, for the Bearcats.

The YAIAA's Wildcats of Dallastown were shut out by the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Bulldogs of Wilson 58-0. Jake Stopper led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 58-yards, including a 3-yard touchdown; followed by Derrick Funk with 45-yards, including a 10-yard touchdown; Jordan Holbert with 45-yards, including a 32-yard touchdown; Josh Smith, scored on a 43-yard end around; and Marc Little with 37-yards, including a 20-yard touchdown. Eric Wimer passed for 67-yards, including a 4-yard touchdown to Dylan Stopper (who also scored on a 3-yard run) and Steve Huber passed for 44-yards, including a 28-yard touchdown to Smith, and Ryne Eversgerd kicked a 32-yard field goal for the Bulldogs. The Wildcats had minus 1-yard rushing and 15-yards passing for the game, as they gained just one first down.

The YAIAA's Division I Colonials of New Oxford rolled over the Division II Bulldogs of West York 35-12. The Smith twins, Alex and Adam led the way for the Colonials again. Quarterback Alex rushed for 200-yards, including touchdowns of 33, 1 and 35-yards, and passed for 57-yards. Running back Adam rushed for 74-yards, including touchdowns of 26 and 5-yards, and Kody Kibler added 37-yards rushing for the Colonials. Tyler Real led the Bulldogs with 30-yards rushing, including a 1-yard touchdown, followed by Brandon Real with 29-yards, Jay Hess with 22-yards and Jerad Kubicki with 8-yards. Quarterback Rob Estep passed for 222-yards, including a 65-yard touchdown to Josh Koht (who caught 4 passes for 119-yards) and 3 passes for 57-yards to Zach Snellbaker for the Bulldogs.

The YAIAA's Division I Lions of Red Lion defeated the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Golden Mules of Solanco 27-9. Joe Doyle rushed for 128-yards, including touchdowns of 20 and 1-yards, followed by Ethan Becker with 35-yards, including a 25-yard touchdown for the Lions. Taylor Gunder passed for 158-yards, including a touchdown of 8-yards to Trent Thomas (who caught 6 passes for 80-yards) and 2 passes for 32-yards to Doyle for the Lions. Mike Brooks led the Golden Mules rushing attack with 61-yards, followed by quarterback Dustin Musselman with 37-yards. Musselman also passed for 96-yards, including a 45-yard touchdown to Brooks (who caught 2 passes for 60-yards). Nic Lewis kicked a 20-yard field goal to open the scoring for the Golden Mules.

The YAIAA's Division I Rockets of Spring Grove shutout the Mid-Penn's Wildcats of Mechanicsburg 16-0. Matt Duncan led the Rockets with 82-yards rushing, followed by Erik Brough with 64-yards and Trevor Trapnell with 27-yards, including a 4-yard touchdown. Senior quarterback Trapnell passed for 111-yards, including a 71-yard touchdown to Josh Miller. Jason Misiiti led the Wildcats with 52-yards rushing, followed by Leftenant with 35. Zeigler passed for 149-yards and Gates led the receivers with 3 for 71-yards for the Wildcats.

The Division II Rams of Kennard-Dale upended the Division III Thunderbolts of Littlestown 24-7. Justin Boland led the Rams with 99-yards rushing, followed by Doug McClean with 85-yards, Brandon Marousek with 83-yards, including touchdowns of 22 and 1-yards, and Beau Roeder with 63-yards. Boland also threw an 8-yard touchdown pass to Josh Hare and Francis Bowman kicked a 47-yard field goal (a school record) for the Rams. Corey Beaver led the Thunderbolts with 82-yards rushing, including a 5-yard touchdown, followed by Brian Zelanko with 50-yards, Luke Reichert with 40-yards and Cody Myers with 6-yards. Quarterback

Reichart also completed 5 passes for 83-yards for the Thunderbolts.

The YAIAA's Golden Knights of Eastern York were upended the Lancaster Lebanon League's Indians of Donegal 39-26 in a slugfest. Blaine Miller scored three rushing touchdowns on runs of 3, 59 and 1-yards for the Indians and Ben Earhart notched two more, from 54 and 6-yards out. Beamenderfer also threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Herbert for the Indians. Mike Kraft connected on 4 touchdown passes for the Golden Knights, 10 and 55-yards to Chad Richardson, 31-yards to Alex Seitz and 7-yards to Nicko Karanicolas.

The YAIAA's Division III Eagles of Bermudian Springs ran over the Division II Eagles of Dover 33-6. Ryan Spahr Bermudian Springs with 183-yards rushing, including touchdowns of 3, 5 and 25-yards, followed by Brian Ford with 125-yards, including touchdowns of 8 and 63-yards. Tyler Deputy passed for 75-yards for Bermudian Springs, 45-yards to Ford and 26-yards to Clint Kramer. Korry Yoe led Dover with 38-yards rushing, including a 37-yard touchdown, followed by Vaughn Hebron with 28-yards. Colt Zarilla completed 3 passes for 16-yards and Ben Delp completed 3 passes for 23-yards for Dover.

The YAIAA's Division II Trojans of York Suburban shutout the Division III Nighthawks of Hanover 35-0. Brandon Snyder rushed for 142-yards, including touchdowns of 1 and 8-yards, followed by Robert Kucherich with 55-yards, including a 5-yard touchdown, Lucas Houghtalling with 45-yards, including a 2-yard touchdown, and Chad Smith with 24-yards, including a 2-yard touchdown for the Trojans. Quarterback Nic Shirey led the Nighthawks meager rushing attack with 27-yards and he completed 4 passes for 53-yards. The Nighthawks were held to 39-yards rushing and 53-yards passing for the game, while the Trojans racked up 263-yards rushing and 40-yards passing.

The YAIAA's Division III Cannons of Biglerville bested the Division II Fighting Irish of York Catholic 20-14 in overtime. Ryan Wagaman led the Cannons rushing attack with 23-yards, including the winning touchdown on a one yard plunge in overtime, and passed for 67-yards, including a 39-yard touchdown to Bernard James to tie the game with 38 seconds left in regulation time. The Cannons were also awarded a safety when the Fighting Irish punter ran out of the end zone. Christopher Reagan led the Fighting Irish with 34-yards rushing but Andrew Bernhard's 4-yard touchdown plunge and Donald Wilson's 35-yard return of a fumble for a touchdown accounted for their scores.

The YAIAA's Squires of Delone Catholic fell to the Mid-Penn's Shamrocks of Trinity 30-14. Rod Trevino led the Shamrocks rushing attack with 77-yards, including touchdowns of 48, 2 and 3-yards, followed by Matt Donahue with 56-yards and Brad Lawson with 48. Donahue passed for 44-yards, including a 19-yard touchdown to Christian Kuntz, and Matt Hallahan passed for 23-yards for the Shamrocks. Logan Kwedar led the Squires with 27-yards rushing followed by Michael Kale with 24-yards. Chris Burton scored a touchdown on a 9-yard run and passed for 112-yards, including a 9-yard touchdown to Brayden Daigle (who caught 3 passes for 73-yards), for the Squires.

The YAIAA's Spartans of York County Tech were shut out by the Panthers of St. Vincent Pallotti from Laurel, MD 36-0. Kyle Moore led the Panthers with 170-yards rushing, including touchdowns of 4 and 1-yards. Demetrius Wright passed for 59-yards, including a 36-yard touchdown to Steve Flowers and a 26-yard touchdown to Moore for the Panthers. Matt Dean returned fumble 36-yards for another Panthers score. Antonio Harris led the Spartans with 51-yards rushing, followed by Dontrell Carroll with 7-yards. The Spartans were held to 28-yards rushing and 2-yards passing for the game.

The YAIAA's Division III Knights of Fairfield fell to the Royals of Pius X from Bangor, PA 43-12 in the first night game ever played at Fairfield. Eric Woodruff led the Royals with 154-yards rushing, including touchdowns of 2, 1 and 72-yards. Cole Hildabrant passed for 169-yards, including touchdowns of 38 and 36-yards to Wade Williams (who caught 3 passes for 85-yards) for the Royals. Corey Staples led the Knights with 45-yards rushing, including a 1-yard touchdown, followed by Robby Potts with 26-yards, including a 20-yard touchdown, Robby Koons with 23-yards and Devin Smith with 15-yards. Potts also completed 4 passes for 48-yards for the Knights.

Mid-Penn's Warriors of Gettysburg fell to the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Barons of Manheim Central 42-28. Travis Nissley led the Barons with 88-yards rushing, including an 18-yard touchdown, followed by Nate Groff with 79-yards, including touchdowns of 11 and 61-yards. Groff also returned 3 kickoffs for 109-yards. Tyler Stauffer passed for 72-yards, including a 31-yard touchdown to Ben Fitzkee, for the Barons. Scott Garber returned an interception 34-yards for a touchdown and Zach Summy had 2 interceptions, returning one 32-yards for a touchdown, for the Barons. Evan Lewis passed for 94-yards, including touchdowns of 9 and 5-yards to Storm Woerner and R. J. VanBrakle scored touchdowns on runs of 5 and 5-yards for the Warriors.

Mid-Penn Keystone Division Patriots of Red Land shut out the Mid-Penn Commonwealth's Colts of Cedar Cliff 23-0. Matt Cox led the Patriots with 114-yards rushing, including an 11-yard touchdown, followed by Dan Yenger with 47-yards, including a 22-yard touchdown. Chad Christen kicked a 21-yard field goal and Junior Rodriguez (a defensive end, a backup running back and a national rugby prospect) blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone for a Patriots touchdown. The game took 2 days to play as it was called Friday night with 4:22 remaining in the first half because of rain and lightning and finished Saturday afternoon. We have no information offensive performance of the Colts.
