

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week One

The YAIAA's Mustangs of South Western were defeated by the Mid-Penn's Warriors of Gettysburg 31-13. The Warriors are rated Number 10 in the State in class AAA by the Harrisburg Patriot News and the Mustangs hung in there through the first half, as the score was only 3-0 until sensational quarterback Evan Lewis racked up runs of 13, 5, 25 and 5-yards before scoring on a 32-yard run with 1:03 left in the half. The Warriors broke the game open in the second half as Lewis, held to 40-yards passing in the first half, had 101-yards in the second half to keep drives alive, Justin Jones (who rushed for 113-yards) scored on a 19-yard run, Zach Michael intercepted a Mustangs pass and returned it 40-yards for a touchdown and D. J. Cool scored on a 5-yard pass from Lewis. Lewis rushed for 64-yards and completed 11 passes for 141-yards, and Randy Vaughn completed 2 passes for 4-yards for the Warriors. Michael caught 4 passes for 61-yards, Cool caught 2 for 24-yards (including the 5-yard touchdown), Sean Jones caught 2 for 24-yards, Sean Manahan caught 2 for 22-yards, Cody Trail caught 1 for 8-yards, Logan Riser caught 1 for 3-yards and Sean Shelleman caught 1 for 1-yard for the Warriors. Lewis also kicked a 21-yard field goal for the Warriors. Seth Barnes led the Mustangs rushing attack with 8 carries for 74-yards, followed by Pete Kudla with 14 for 46-yards, Ryan Laughman with 2 for 21-yards (who scored a touchdown on a 16-yard run), Karl Maynor with 2 for 14-yards, Chris Helwig with 2 for 11-yards and David Sager with 2 for 4-yards. John Bingham had 3 carries for minus 4-yards. Quarterback Sager completed 7 passes for 96-yards, including 2 for 48-yards to Marty Kefauver (who scored a touchdown on a 43-yard reception), 2 for 29-yards to Bingham, 2 for 9-yards to Maynor, and 1 for 10-yards to Barnes.

The YAIAA's Division I Panthers of Central York outlasted the Division II Bulldogs of West York for a 23-19 victory. Junior quarterback Brandon Workinger completed an 11-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Wolf with 38 seconds left in the game to pull out the victory. Tly Schildt led the Panthers rushing attack with 61-yards (including a 30-yard touchdown), followed by Parrish Fells with 54-yards, and T.J. Shaffer with 40-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown). Workinger completed 16 passes for 140-yards, including 7 for 60-yards to Wolf, 7 for 42-yards to Blaine Liggins, 1 for 35-yards to Kyle Baublitz and 1 for 3-yards to Schildt. Alex Kelly kicked a 25-yard field goal for the Panthers. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 42-yards, followed by Dan Haverstock with 24-yards. Quarterback Haverstock completed 9 passes for 174-yards and 2 touchdowns, including 3 for 80-yards to Nate Jacobs (who caught a 44-yard touchdown pass), 2 for 44-yards to Blake Campbell (who caught a 36-yard touchdown pass), 2 for 25-yards to Dan Gay, and 2 for 25-yards to Tyler Real.

The YAIAA's Bearcats of York High (William Penn) shutout the Lancaster Lebanon League's Knights of Reading 12-0 in a defensive battle. Brandon Walker led the Bearcats rushing attack with 59-yards, followed by Robert Richardson with 58-yards (he carried once for a 58-yard touchdown jaunt in the first quarter), Mike Kinard with 43-yards (he scored a touchdown on a 10-yard run). Quarterback Malik Generett completed 2 passes for 16-yards and Jordan Davis completed one for 19-yards. Kinard caught 1 for 19-yards, Callum caught 1 for 9-yards and Richardson caught 1 for 7-yards for the Bearcats. Fruquan Gaston led the Knights rushing attack with 32-yards as they were held to 42-yards rushing. Robert Kresge completed 7 passes for 52-

yards and Malcolm Williams completed 1 for 8-yards. Williams caught 5 passes for 32-yards, Francis Camara caught 2 for 25-yards and Alex Wagner caught 1 for 3-yards for the Knights.

The Mid-Penn Keystone Division Patriots of Red Land (the 2006 District 3 class AAA champion) defeated the YAIAA's Wildcats of Dallastown 31-17. Senior quarterback Skyler Hunt led the Patriots on scoring drives of 81, 70, 55, and 55-yards in the second quarter, ending with 3 touchdowns and a field goal, to take a commanding lead. Dan Yenger led the Patriots rushing attack with 90-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), followed by Junior Rodriguez with 49-yards (including a 38-yard touchdown), Nicco Farris with 6-yards, Carl Scheaffer with 5-yards and Kyle Ostot with 4-yards. Hunt completed 11 passes for 204-yards and 2 touchdowns. Dan Klein caught 4 passes for 78-yards (including a 30-yard touchdown), Teed Wertz caught 3 passes for 55-yards (including a 45-yard touchdown), Ostot caught 2 passes for 35-yards, Rodriguez caught 1 for 20-yards, and Nick Liddell caught 1 pass for 16-yards for the Patriots. Chad Christen rushed for minus 6-yards and kicked a 38-yard field goal for the Patriots. Matt Rae led the Wildcats rushing attack with 50-yards, followed by Kevin Frisby with 37-yards, Kole Kraut with 36-yards, Chris Hunt with 26-yards (including a 7-yard touchdown), Jon Heird with 10-yards, Alex Orwig with 5-yards, Tyler Imhof with 5-yards and Chris Bream with 3-yards. Quarterback Frisby completed 8 passes for 108-yards and a touchdown. Le caught 4 passes for 43-yards, Ben Kline caught 3 passes for 58-yards (including a 35-yard touchdown) and Heird caught 1 for 7-yards for the Wildcats. Trent Bear kicked an 18-yard field goal for the wildcats.

The YAIAA's Division I Colonials of New Oxford pulled out a 20-14 victory over the Division III Thunderbolts of Littlestown with a 60-yard touchdown pass from Ross Hall to Ryan Luckenbaugh with 1:15 left in the game. Doug Black led the Colonials rushing attack with 106-yards (including a 44-yard touchdown), followed by Ross Hall with 40-yards, Jake Groft with 32-yards and Erik Harris with 24-yards. Quarterback Ross completed 5 passes for 140-yards (including the 60-yard touchdown to Luckenbaugh and a 39-yard touchdown to Harris). Luckenbaugh caught 2 passes for 79-yards, John Watz caught 1 for 18-yards and Groft caught 1 for 4-yards for the Colonials. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts rushing attack with 60-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown). Quarterback Jarrod Reynolds completed 8 passes for 180-yards and a touchdown for the Thunderbolts. Jordan Staub caught 3 for 79-yards, Garrett Bull caught 3 for 40-yards (including a 9-yard touchdown), Matt Koontz caught 1 for 66-yards and Beaver caught 1 for minus 5-yards for the Thunderbolts.

The YAIAA's Division I Lions of Red Lion trounced the Division II Rams of Kennard-Dale 48-10. Quarterback Ethan Becker starred for the Lions as he completed 10 passes for 249-yards and 4 touchdowns. Becker also led the Lions rushing attack with 75-yards, followed by Brett Fishel with 32-yards (including touchdowns of 18 and 4-yards), Corey Watson with 29-yards and a touchdown, and Stephan States with 17-yards. Taylor Dolan caught 3 passes for 92-yards (including a 67-yard touchdown), Fishel caught 2 for 41-yards, Todd Maciejewski caught 1 for 58-yards and a touchdown, Seden Craig caught 1 for 18-yards and a touchdown, States caught 1 for 15-yards and a touchdown, Joseph Ross caught 1 for 14-yards and Maxwell Horka caught 1 for 11-yards for the Lions. Jordan Senkbell led the Rams rushing attack with 70-yards, followed by Duncan Leftridge with 32-yards (including a 21-yard touchdown), Doug McClean with 31-yards, Nate Wilkinson with 7-yards and Matt Romoser with 4-yards. Leftridge completed 2

passes for 37-yards, both to McClean. Francis Bowman kicked a 25-yard field goal for the Rams.

The YAIAA's Division I Rockets of Spring Grove edged the Division II Warriors of Susquehannock 12-7. Joey Rudd led the Rockets rushing attack with 65-yards (including a 21-yard touchdown), followed by Cory Baker with 28-yards, Caleb Burns with 21-yards and Ian Smith with 12-yards. Quarterback Smith completed 9 passes for 125-yards. Matt Brookhart caught 2 for 53-yards, followed by Rudd with 2 for 26, Purnell Richardson with 2 for 22, Matt Ducan with 1 for 9, Coty Slothour with 1 for 9 and Cameron Dell with 1 for 6-yards for the Rockets. Mike Kelly led the Warriors rushing attack with 43-yards, followed by Ben Norris with 11-yards, Patrick Miller with 10-yards, Corey Shelton with 9-yards, Jimmy Hershey with 5-yards, Jhn Ridgeway with 2-yards and John Robinson with 2-yards. Quarterback Miller completed 10 passes for 99-yards and a touchdown. Kelly caught 3 for 18-yards (including a 12-yard touchdown), followed by Norris with 2 for 48, Billy Kerr with 2 for 16, Hershey with 1 for 9, Shelton with 1 for 4 and Tyler Ward with 1 for 4-yards for the Warriors.

The YAIAA's Golden Knights of Eastern York were blasted by the Lancaster Lebanon League's Crimson Tide of Columbia 50-6. Ben Guiles led the Crimson tide rushing attack with 104-yards (including touchdown runs of 15, 24 and 11-yards), followed by Dakotah Lightfoot with 67-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), and Carlos Malave with 50-yards. Quarterback Mike Seibert completed 10 passes for 233-yards and 3 touchdowns. Colby Tuell caught 6 for 150-yards (including a 35-yard touchdown), Yahya McIntyre caught 2 for 40-yards, Garrett Mowrer caught 1 for 25-yards and a touchdown, and Don Thompson caught 1 for 8-yards for the Crimson Tide. Quarterback Mike Kraft led the Golden Knights rushing attack with 15-yards and he completed 12 passes for 105-yards and a touchdown. Corey Hershner caught 4 passes for 46-yards, Ian Melhorn caught 4 for 19-yards, Joe Giandalia caught 3 for 24-yards and Alex Seitz caught 1 for 16-yards and a touchdown for the Golden Knights.

The YAIAA's Eagles of Dover shutout the Mid-Penn Colonial Division Blackhawks of Susquenita 42-0. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 145-yards (including touchdowns of 86 and 2-yards), followed by Dan Fahringer with 83-yards and Korry Yohe with 40-yards (including an 8-yard touchdown). Quarterback Colt Zarilla scored a touchdown on a 1-yard run and completed 6 passes for 152-yards and 2 touchdowns. Carlos Rivera caught 2 passes for 82-yards (including a 18-yard touchdown), and Andy Wolfgang caught 2 passes for 53-yards (including a 23-yard touchdown) for the Eagles. Tim Wagner led the Blackhawks rushing attack with 36-yards and he completed 3 passes for 48-yards as the Blackhawks were held to 86 total yards of offense.

The YAIAA's Division II Trojans of York Suburban fell to the Mid-Penn's Greyhounds of Shippensburg 25-13. Ethan Naylor led the Greyhounds rushing attack with 140-yards (including touchdowns of 36 and 2-yards), followed by Jermayne Webber with 43-yards, Zach Mason with 28-yards and a touchdown, Vinny Secary with 12-yards, Jared Hamilton with 6-yards, and Craig Van Scyoc with 4-yards. Van Scyoc completed 6 passes for 53-yards. Lore Horst caught 1 for 15-yards, followed by Dakota Pierce with 1 for 15, James Wenger with 1 for 9, Naylor with 1 for 9, and Webber with 2 for 5-yards for the Greyhounds. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans rushing attack with 60-yards, followed by Jordan Knaub with 28-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown),

Nathaniel Cross with 23-yards, Asa Smith with 16-yards, and Terry Owens with 1-yard. Joseph Merkle completed 11 passes for 139-yards and a touchdown. Wagner caught 7 passes for 82-yards (including a 14-yard touchdown), Corey Bright caught 2 for 14-yards, Cross caught 1 for 32-yards, and Dan Johnson caught 1 for 11-yards for the Trojans.

The YAIAA's Division III Squires of Delone Catholic upended the Division II Fighting Irish of York Catholic 22-6 in a game that was scoreless until the fourth quarter. Michael Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 105-yards (including a 32-yard touchdown), followed by Noah Landi with 36-yards, Brayden Daigle with 27-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown), Joshua McNutt with 22-yards, Dustin Reed with 10-yards, Jon Lawrence with 2-yards and Christopher Burton with 1-yard and a touchdown. Quarterback Burton completed 4 passes for 59-yards. Daigle caught 3 for 41-yards and Nick Hoddinott caught 1 for 18-yards for the Squires. Frank Paolantonio led the Fighting Irish with 24-yards rushing, followed by Christopher Reagan with 11-yards and Nick Falci with 9-yards. Quarterback Reagan completed 23 passes for 225-yards and a touchdown. Seth Hake caught 10 for 145-yards, John Full caught 7 for 59-yards, Sean Obermeier caught 4 for 16-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), and Jay Goldstein caught 2 for 5-yards for the Fighting Irish.

The YAIAA's Division III Eagles of Bermudian Springs fell to the Mid-Penn's Polar Bears of Northern York 38-14. Michael Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 96-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), followed by Irvin Smith III with 73-yards, Edward Stephenson with 16-yards, Alex Potteiger with 3-yards and Jordan Rutherford with minus 16-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown). Quarterback Rutherford completed 8 passes for 105-yards and 2 touchdowns. Davies caught 3 for 36-yards (including a 9-yard touchdown), Ryan Aumiller caught 2 for 25-yards, Robert Bleiler caught 1 for 28-yards, Don Bell caught 1 for 8-yards and a touchdown, Harrison Sanders caught 1 for 8-yards for the Polar Bears. Jake Scott returned an interception 4-yards for a touchdown and Matthew Sheibley kicked a 33-yard field goal for the Polar Bears. Derek Mummert led the Eagles rushing attack with 66-yards, followed by Ben Goldhammer with 20-yards, Ben Stroup with 16-yards, Jeisson Lloret with 13-yards and Tyler Deputy with 6-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown). Deputy completed 5 passes for 42-yards. Stroup caught 3 for 10-yards, Joe Smith caught 1 for 23-yards and a touchdown, and Mummert caught 1 for 9-yards for the Eagles.

The YAIAA's Division III Cannons of Biglerville lost to the Tornadoes of Mount Carmel 47-20. James Haynes led the Tornadoes rushing attack with 166-yards (including touchdowns of 8, 14 and 59 yards), followed by Julius Demetrius with 39-yards (including a 18-yard touchdown), Dave DeMarco with 21-yards, Justin Pellowski with 17-yards (including a 13-yard touchdown), Matt Hepler with 10-yards and Keith Kisela with 4-yards. Marcus Wasilewski completed 9 passes for 118-yards. Matt Moroz caught 4 for 53-yards, Demarco caught 2 for 22-yards, Matt Koveleski caught 1 for 25-yards, Colin Menapace caught 1 for 11-yards and Quinn McCracken caught 1 for 7-yards for the Tornadoes. Haynes also returned a kickoff 83-yards for a touchdown and Nik Gratti returned a fumble 61-yards for a touchdown for the Tornadoes. Jeff Foster led the Cannons rushing attack with 57-yards, followed by Tyrel Taughinbaugh with 49-yards, Kyle Whitmoyer with 20-yards (including a 13-yard touchdown) and Nic Lieberum with 3-yards. Quarterback Whitmoyer completed 13 passes for 223-yards and 2 touchdowns. Taughinbaugh caught 7 for 127-yards, Mike Wagner caught 3 for 61-yards (including a 33-yard

touchdown), Zach Lieberum caught 2 for 32-yards and Parker Showers caught 1 for 3-yards and a touchdown.

The YAIAA's Division III Nighthawks of Hanover were trounced by the Lancaster-Lebanon Division III Raiders of Eastern Lebanon County (ELCO) 35-7. Aaron Achey led the Raiders rushing attack with 138-yards (including a 72-yard touchdown) followed by Weatherholtz with 48-yards, Carpenter with 46-yards, Arnold with 34-yards, Bowman with 13-yards, and Rohr with 4-yards. Achey completed 6 passes for 63-yards and a touchdown. Carpenter caught 2 for 27-yards (including a 10-yard touchdown), A. Wenger caught 2 for 18-yards, and Klingaman caught 2 for 18-yards for the Raiders. Lucas Sandoe returned a fumble 24-yards for a touchdown for the Raiders. Zack Wentz led the Knighthawks rushing attack with 37-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Tyler Meckley with 22-yards, Joe Null with 16-yards, and quarterback Josh Livelsberger and Zac Tine rushed for minus yardage. Livelsberger completed 5 passes for 51-yards. Zach Wolford caught 4 for 45-yards and Meckley caught 1 for 6-yards for the Knighthawks. Sophomore Knighthawks fullback Joe Null was leading the Knighthawks in carries when he went out with an injury on the first play of the second half.

The YAIAA's Spartans of York County Tech shutout the All American League's Warriors of Carson Long Military Institute 48-0 to get new coach Buddy Looks off to a great start. Junior quarterback Kent Weibley led the Spartans rushing attack with 74-yards (including touchdowns of 1 and 49-yards), followed by Devin Cromedy with 43-yards (including touchdowns of 11, 6 and 22-yards), August Jamison with 39-yards, Anthony Green with 33-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), Lee Yeager with 22-yards, Angel Rodriguez with 9-yards, Dejon Talley with 5-yards and Jones with 2-yards. Weibley completed 2 passes for 69-yards and Green completed 4 passes for 69-yards and a touchdown. Jamison caught 3 passes for 57-yards, Talley caught 2 for 41-yards (including a 12-yard touchdown), and Rodriguez caught 1 for 40-yards for the Spartans. Mike Lvosky led the Warriors with 20-yards rushing, followed by Vache Inkavdze with 15-yards, and Jonathan Chen with 4-yards. Quarterback Alex Koff rushed for minus 5-yards and completed 5 passes for 18-yards and Bryan Simans completed 2 passes for 11-yards for the Warriors. Riaan Jianadu caught 4 passes for 24-yards, Lvosky caught 2 passes for no yardage, and Naim Cephas caught 1 pass for 5-yards for the Warriors.

The YAIAA's Division III Knights of Fairfield bested the Spartans of Bishop Walsh of Cumberland, MD 8-6 in a game marred by 10 fumbles, 2 interceptions and 16 penalties for 153-yards. Devin Smith led the Knights rushing attack with 141-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Corey Staples with 40-yards, Andrew Potts with 2-yards, and Derek Smith with 1-yard. Quarterback Aaron Sewell rushed once for minus 3-yards and completed 4 passes for 39-yards; 14-yards to Staples, 12-yards to Smith, 8-yards to Travis Stambaugh and 5-yards to Keith Housel for the Knights. The Knights also recorded a safety when Spartans runner Dylan D'Atri was downed in the end zone, and Jeff Adams intercepted a Spartans pass in the end zone to prevent a touchdown. D'Atri led the Spartans rushing attack with 143-yards, followed by Williams with 12-yards. Quarterback Zac Hare completed 9 passes for 139-yards and a touchdown. Lehman caught 4 for 90-yards, D'Atri caught 2 for 12-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown), Clifford caught 1 for 17-yards, Williams caught 1 for 15-yards and McDonald caught 1 for 5-yards for the Spartans. A 25-yard field goal attempt by the Spartans bounced off the right upright at the end of the game.
