

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Two

The YAIAA's Division I Mustangs of South Western were edged by the Division II Warriors of Susquehannock 26-21. The Susquehannock Warriors gained 269-yards rushing and 72-yards passing for a total of 341-yards of offense. The rushing attack was led by Mike Kelly with 14 carries for 132-yards and 3 touchdowns (21, 40 and 46-yards), followed by Corey Shelton with 6 for 80-yards and a 48-yard touchdown, Jordan Robertson with 3 for 23-yards, Ben Norris with 3 for 22-yards, Jimmy Hershey with 4 for 18-yards, and Patrick Miller with 5 carries for minus 6-yards. Kelly also caught a pass from Miller for a 2-point conversion. Miller completed 5 passes for the 72-yards, spread among 5 receivers: Norris for 17-yards, Shelton with 17, Dakota Heath with 15, Hershey with 13-yards, and Tyler Ward with 10-yards. Robertson also intercepted a pass for the Warriors. The Mustangs gained 185-yards rushing and 175-yards passing for a total of 360 yards of offense. Seth Barnes led the rushing attack with 11 carries for 94-yards and a touchdown, followed by Pete Kudla with 15 for 76-yards, Chris Helwig with 3 for 10-yards, John Bingham with 1 for 8-yards, Duane Rowlette with 1 for 1-yard, and David Sager with 6 carries for minus 4-yards. Sager completed 9 passes for the 175-yards and a touchdown. Barnes led the receivers with 3 receptions for 89-yards and a touchdown, followed by Marty Kefauver with 3 for 63-yards and a touchdown, Cody Mundorff with 2 for 16-yards and Helwig with 1 reception for 7-yards. John Bingham blocked 2 extra point kicks, Duane Rowlette intercepted a pass and returned it 12-yards, and Cody Mundorff and Josh Rummel recovered fumbles for the Mustangs.

The Mid-Penn's Polar Bears of Northern York bested the YAIAA's Division I Panthers of Central York 29-3. Michael Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 111-yards and touchdowns of 3 and 23-yards, followed by Bubba Smith with 49, Eddie Stephenson with 24, Robert DeMuro with 2-yards, and Jordan Rutherford with minus 1-yard. Rutherford complete 8 passes for 98-yards and 2 touchdowns. Donnie Bell caught 4 passes for 52-yards and a 31-yard touchdown, Robbie Blieler caught 2 for 27-yards, Ryan Aumiller caught 1 for a 13-yard touchdown, and Hank Sanders caught 1 for 6-yards for the Polar Bears. Matt Sheibley kicked a 45-yard field goal for the Polar Bears. Tly Schildt led the Panthers rushing attack with 33-yards, followed by Brandon Workinger with 13, T.J. Shaffer with 6, Parrish Fells with 5-yards, and Lmar Calhoun with minus 1-yard. Workinger completed 16 passes for 159-yards. Ryan Wolf caught 6 for 51-yards, Fells caught 2 for 42-yards, Blaine Loggins caught 4 for 38-yards, Charles Anderson caught 1 for 13-yards, Nick Petry caught 2 for 9-yards, and Schildt caught 1 for 6-yards for the Panthers. Alex Kelly kicked a 24-yard field goal for the Panthers.

The YAIAA's Bearcats of York High (William Penn) shutout the Lancaster Lebanon League's Red Tornadoes of J. P. McCaskey 42-0. Mike Kinard led the Bearcats rushing attack with 98-yards and touchdowns of 12 and 60-yards, followed by Stephante Doby with 31-yards and a 19-yard touchdown, Wilfredo Martinez with 24-yards, Brandon Walker with 22-yards and a 3-yard touchdown, Ratik Drakeford with 16, Robert Richardson with 16, and Jordan Davis with minus 4-yards. Davis completed 5 passes for 178-yards and 2 touchdowns and Malik Generette completed 3 passes for 30-yards. Richardson caught 4 passes for 145-yards and a 33-yard touchdown, Andre Callum caught 2 for 26-yards, Kinard caught 1 for a 30-yard touchdown, and Kevin Kears caught 1 for 7-yards for the Bearcats. Newt Miller returned an interception 54-

yards for a touchdown for the Bearcats. Xavier Dominguez led the Red Tornadoes with 9-yards rushing as the Bearcats held the Red Tornadoes to 9-yards rushing and 91-yards passing for 100-yards of offense for the game. Adrian Westbrook completed 4 passes for 48-yards and James Boudier completed 4 passes for 23-yards. Daniel Pena caught 4 for 48-yards, Dominguez caught 2 for 22-yards, Ryan Feldman caught 1 for 16-yards, and Taylor Schmalhofer caught 1 for 5-yards for the Red Tornadoes.

The YAIAA's Wildcats of Dallastown were defeated by the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Bulldogs of Wilson 31-10. Jordan Holbert led the Bulldogs with 31-yards, followed by Zacc Groff with 27-yards and a 16-yard touchdown, Nick Greth with 22-yards, and Steve Huber with 4-yards. Quarterback Huber completed 18 passes for 209-yards and 3 touchdowns. Chris Hartzell caught 5 for 54-yards and a 11-yard touchdown, Alex Fegley caught 3 for 43-yards, Peniel St. Julien caught 3 for 39-yards and a 16-yard touchdown, Mark Daniels caught 3 for 29-yards, Jordan Holbert caught 1 for a 22-yard touchdown, Pat Zerbe caught 1 for 10-yards, and Brandon Keeny and Ben Owens each caught 1 for 6-yards for the Bulldogs. Jon Wagner recorded a safety for the Bulldogs. Jon Heird led the Wildcats rushing attack with 47-yards, followed by Andre Le with 16, Matt Rae with 11, Kole Kraut with 1, and Kevin Frisby with minus 29-yards and a 1-yard touchdown. Quarterback Frisby completed 3 passes for 48-yards. Eric Shoff caught 1 for 33-yards, Le caught 1 for 9-yards, and Kraut caught 1 for 6-yards for the Wildcats. Trent Bear kicked a 45-yard field goal for the Wildcats.

The YAIAA's Division II Bulldogs of West York edged the Division I Colonials of New Oxford 19-15. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 119-yards, including touchdowns of 2 and 39-yards, followed by Dan Haverstock with 65-yards, and Jay Hess with a 7-yard touchdown run. Quarterback Haverstock completed 5 passes for 71-yards. Nate Jacobs caught 1 for 36-yards, Real caught 2 for 21-yards, Blake Campbell caught 1 for 11-yards, and Hess caught 1 for 3-yards. Ross Hall led the Colonials rushing attack with 102-yards and a 14-yard touchdown, followed by Doug Black with 29, Bobby Laughman with 19, Erik Harris with 15, Brandon Markle with 9, Tanner McNutt with 9-yards and a 1-yard touchdown, and Jake Groft with 2-yards. Quarterback Ross completed 7 passes for 102-yards, including 4 for 79-yards to Ryan Luckenbaugh and 3 for 23-yards to Harris for the Colonials.

The YAIAA's Division I Lions of Red Lion shutout the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Golden Mules of Solanco 21-0. Brett Fishel led the Lions rushing attack with 132-yards and touchdowns of 6 and 2-yards, followed by Ethan Becker with 102-yards and a 1-yard touchown, Jake Hagan with 40-yards, and Joe Ross with 21-yards. Becker completed 4 passes for 50-yards. Todd Maciejewski caught 2 for 37-yards, Taylor Dolan caught 1 for 10-yards, and Fishel caught 1 for 3-yards. Jordan Elvey led the Golden Mules rushing attack with 71-yards, followed by Neil McGettigan with 20, Mike Brooks with 10, Jeremy Trimble with 5, and Ben Miller with minus 3-yards. The YAIAA's Division I Rockets of Spring Grove were defeated by the Mid-Penn's Wildcats of Mechanicsburg 34-13. minus 2-yards. Zeigler completed 7 passes for 131-yards and 2 touchdowns. Vaughn Hebron led the Dover Eagles rushing attack with 193-yards and touchdowns of 1, 58 and 72-yards, followed by Harry Caraballo with a 59-yard touchdown, Dan Fahringer with 32-yards and a 1-yard touchdown, Colt Zarilla with 22, Craig Hall with 3-yards, and Andy Wolfgang with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Zarilla completed 3 passes for 83-yards. Wolfgang caught 2 for 50-yards and a 23-yard touchdown and John Miller caught 1 for 33-yards for the Dover Eagles. Derek Mummerk led the Bermudian Springs Eagles rushing attack with 109-yards, followed by Adam Stroup with 54-yards and a 9-yard touchdown, Preston Green with 50-yards, Ben Goldhamer with 14-yards, Tyler Deputy with minus 8-yards and a 1-yard

touchdown, and Alex Hartzell with minus 10-yards. Quarterback Deputy completed 7 passes for 56-yards. Clint Kramer caught 3 for 30-yards, Mummert caught 1 for 18-yards, Joe Smith caught 1 for 9-yards, Mitch Highlands caught 1 for 8-yards, and Stroup caught 1 for minus 9-yards for the Bermudian Springs Eagles.

The YAIAA's Division II Trojans of York Suburban shutout the Division III Nighthawks of Hanover 42-0. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans rushing attack with 85-yards and a 40-yard touchdown, followed by Nathaniel Cross with a 55-yard touchdown, Stan Williams with 27-yards, Darrius Watson with a 22-yard touchdown, Jordan Knaub with 14-yards, Terry Owens with 10-yards, Asa Smith with 6, Joe Merkle with 5, Jake Hawkins with 3-yards, Tyler Knaub with a 2 yard touchdown, and Flores DeAlava with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Merkle completed 6 passes for 97-yards and sophomore quarterback Jordan Knaub completed 3 passes for 28-yards. Dan Johnson caught 2 passes for 54-yards, Cole Wagner caught 4 passes for 40-yards and a 6-yard touchdown, Watson caught 1 for 11-yards, Corey Bright caught 1 for 10-yards, and Waltmyer caught 1 for 10-yards. Asa Smith returned an interception 32-yards for a touchdown and Darrius Watson intercepted another pass for the Trojans. The Trojans ushered in a new Sprinturf field and a new coach (Bill Kerr) in fine fashion. The Knighthawks were held to minus 21-yards rushing and 45-yards passing, for a net offense of 24-yards for the game. Quarterback Joe Livelsberger completed 6 passes for 45-yards. Zach Wolford caught 5 passes for 38-yards and Ethan Gross caught 1 for 7-yards for the Knighthawks.

The YAIAA's Division III Cannons of Biglerville bested the Division II Fighting Irish of York Catholic 25-12. Jeffrey Foster led the Cannons with 78-yards rushing and a 1-yard touchdown, followed by Kyle Whitmoyer with 75-yards and touchdowns of 1 and 20-yards, Tyrel Taughinbaugh with 31-yards, and Nic Lieberum with 15-yards. Whitmoyer completed 5 passes for 125-yards and a touchdown. Mike Wagner caught 4 passes for 104-yards and Lieberum caught 1 for 21-yards and a touchdown for the Cannons. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 62-yards and a 3-yard touchdown, followed by Paolantonio with 25-yards and a 14-yard touchdown, Chris Reagan with 18-yards, and Booty with 2-yards. Quarterback Reagan completed 9 passes for 123-yards, including 5 for 57-yards to Full and 4 for 66-yards to Seth Hake, for the Fighting Irish.

The YAIAA's Squires of Delone Catholic fell to the Mid-Penn's Shamrocks of Trinity 34-13. Matt Donahue led the Shamrocks rushing attack with 113-yards and a 67-yard touchdown, followed by Marino Magaro with 108-yards and touchdowns of 11 and 5-yards, Ted Spinelli with 53-yards, John Slifka with 28-yards, Christian Kuntz with 14-yards and Steve Kazor with 12-yards. Quarterback Donahue completed 9 passes for 84-yards and a 33-yard touchdown and Spinelli completed 1 for 4-yards. Kazor caught 4 passes for 61-yards and a 33-yard touchdown, followed by Kuntz with 4 for 42, Joe Kindler with 1 for 10, Matt Brosius with 1 for 2-yards and Slifka with 1 for no yardage for the Shamrocks. Kindler and Spinelli each had an interception and Andrew Pery recovered a fumble for the Shamrocks. Michael Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 111-yards and a 80-yard touchdown, followed by Joshua McNutt with 23, John Lawrence with 3, Dustin Reed with 3, Brayden Daigle with 2-yards, quarterback Christopher Burton with minus 2-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown, and Noah Landi with minus 5-yards. Burton completed 5 passes for 61-yards and Landi completed 1 for no yards. Daigle caught 3

passes for 33-yards, McNutt caught 1 for 19, Charlie Hartz caught 1 for 9, and Justin George caught 1 pass for 4-yards for the Squires.

The YAIAA's Spartans of York County Tech fell to the All-American League's Red Raiders of Our Lady of Lourdes Regional 22-14. Matthew Bendas led the Red Raiders rushing attack with 75-yards, Michael Bastian with 28-yards, Tyler Reichwein with 18-yards, and quarterback Brian Dunleavy rushed for minus 21-yards. Donleavy completed 9 passes for 204-yards, including 3 for 105-yards to Davis Schweitzer, 2 for 47-yards and a 19-yard touchdown to Chris Johnson, 2 for 28-yards and a 25-yard touchdown to Matt Gilger, 1 for 16-yards to Nathan Varano and 1 for 8-yards to Bastian. Johnson also ran the opening kickoff back 80-yards for a touchdown for the Red Raiders. DeJon O'Connor led the Spartans rushing attack with 22-yards, followed by Kent Weibley with 15-yards and a 7-yard touchdown, August Jamison with 12, Davon Talley with 8, Lee Yeager with 5, Angel Rodriguez with 3-yards, and Devin Cromedy rushed for minus 11-yards. Devin Smith led the Knights rushing attack with 246-yards and touchdowns of 74, 54 and 39-yards, followed by Jeff Adams with 105-yards and an 8-yard touchdown, Andy Potts with 3-yards, Corey Staples with 3-yards, Travis Stambaugh with 2-yards, Ryan Shultz with minus 3-yards and Aaron Sewell with minus 12-yards and a 3-yard touchdown. Sewell completed 4 passes for 35-yards. Shultz caught 1 pass for 13-yards, Keith Housel caught 2 passes for 10-yards, and Devin Smith caught 1 for 12-yards for the Knights.

Mid-Penn's Warriors of Gettysburg blasted to the Lancaster-Lebanon League's Barons of Manheim Central 44-27. Quarterback Evan Lewis led the Warriors rushing attack with 68-yards and an 8-yard touchdwn, followd by Justin Jones with 55-yards, Cody Trail with 38-yards and a 12-yard touchdown, Zach Sharrah with 33-yards, Storm Woerner with a 3-yard touchdown, and Kyle Gastley with 2-yards.
