

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Three

The YAIAA's Division I Mustangs of South Western defeated the Division III Thunderbolts of Littlestown 27-7. Pete Kudla led the Mustangs rushing attack with 102-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown), followed by sophomore J. R. Mummert with 74-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), Seth Barnes with 70-yards, John Bingham with 24-yards, Duane Rowlette with no yards on a carry and quarterback David Sager with minus 10-yards on a carry. Sager completed 8 passes for 135-yards and 2 touchdowns. Barnes caught 2 passes for 53-yards, followed by Bingham with 3 for 47-yards, Drew Sneeringer with 1 for an 18-yard touchdown, and Marty Kefauver with 2 for 17-yards for the Mustangs. Chris Helwig recorded 2 sacks and Adam Day, Chris McDonald, and Josh Rummel each had a sack for the Mustangs. Rowlette defended 3 passes, Zach Hagerman defended 2, and Travis Scott defended 1. Bryan Bosley, Blair Messenger, Andrew Sells, and Derek Supel each were credited with a Pass hurry. Rowlette intercepted a pass and Andrew Sells intercepted a pass that he returned 12-yards for the Mustangs. Drew Sneeringer led the Mustangs with 10 tackles. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts rushing attack with 22-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Matt Koons with 5-yards, quarterback Jerrod Reynolds with 1-yard, and Tyler Fodor with minus 1-yard, as the Thunderbolts were held to 27-yards rushing. Reynolds completed 5 passes for 120-yards. Star wide receiver Jordan Staub caught 2 passes for 57-yards, before leaving the game with an injury at the end of a 35-yard reception in the second quarter. Garrett Bill caught 1 for 29-yards, Justin Emig caught 1 for 18-yards and Fodor caught 1 for 16-yards for the Thunderbolts.

The YAIAA's Division I Panthers of Central York edged the Division II Eagles of Dover 21-20. Blaine Liggins led the Panthers rushing attack with 102-yards (including touchdowns of 22 and 7-yards), followed by James Culp with 58, Tly Schildt with 20, Parrish Fells with 5, and quarterback Brandon Workinger with minus 4-yards. Workinger completed 2 passes for 17-yards and Culp completed 1 for 17-yards. Nick Petry caught 1 for 17-yards, Ryan Wolf caught 1 for 13-yards, and Liggins caught 1 for 4-yards for the Panthers. L'Mar Calhoun returned a kickoff 90-yards for a touchdown for the Panthers, had a punt return for a touchdown called back, and still amassed 198-yards in returns for the game. Kyle Baublitz with 13 and James English with 10 led the Panthers in tackles. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 192-yards (including a 65-yard touchdown), followed by Dan Fahringer with 56-yards (including a 14-yard touchdown), and quarterback Colt Zarilla with minus 2-yards. Zarilla completed 2 passes for 29-yards and a touchdown. Andy Wolfgang caught 1 for a 22-yard touchdown, and Bryton Reaser caught 1 for 7-yards for the Eagles. The Panthers blocked an extra point attempt and the Eagles misfired on a 40-yard field goal attempt.

The YAIAA's Division II Bulldogs of West York defeated the Division I Wildcats of Dallastown 27-9. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 139-yards (including touchdowns of 5 and 3-yards), followed by quarterback Dan Haverstock with 98-yards (including a 25-yard touchdown), Jay Hess with 56-yards, Corey Harris with 24-yards, Tom Ort with 1-yard, Alex George with minus 1-yard, Skyler Heath with minus 3-yards, and Dan Mohler with minus 9-yards. Haverstock completed 4 passes for 70-yards and a touchdown. Nate Jacobs caught 2 passes for 38-yards and a 7-yard touchdown, Blake Campbell caught 1 for 18-yards, and Nate Kosalek caught 1 for 14-yards for the Bulldogs. Jon Heird led the Wildcats with 52-yards,

followed by Kole Kraut with 48-yards, Matt Rae with 29-yards, Andrew Le with 10-yards, quarterback Kevin Frisby with minus 5-yards, and Trent Bear with minus 24-yards. Frisby completed 5 passes for 75-yards and Chris Hunt completed 2 for 57-yards and a touchdown. Eric Shoff caught 4 passes for 76-yards, Heird caught 2 for 28-yards, and Chris Bream caught 1 for a 28-yard touchdown for the Wildcats. Trent Bear kicked a 40-yard field goal for the Wildcats.

The YAIAA's Division I Colonials of New Oxford defeated the Division III Squires of Delone Catholic 27-13. Erik Harris led the Colonials rushing attack with 72-yards, followed by Doug Black with 68-yards, Ross Hall with 34-yards (including 2 touchdowns of 1-yard each), Tanner McNutt with 20, Josh Baschke with 11, Ryan Luckenbaugh with 4, and Jake Groft with 3-yards. Quarterback Hall completed 5 passes for 66-yards and a touchdown and Harris completed 1 pass for a 25-yard touchdown to Luckenbaugh. Harris caught 2 passes for 28-yards and a 20-yard touchdown, Luckenbaugh caught 2 for 37-yards, McNutt caught 1 for 23-yards, and Jon Watts caught 1 for 3-yards for the Colonials. Michael Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 76-yards, followed by Dustin Reed with 20, Brayden Gaigle with 18, Joshua McNutt with 16-yards. Quarterback Chris Burton lost 17-yards on 7 carries but scored a 1-yard touchdown for the Squires. Burton completed 6 passes for 80-yards. Charlie Hertz caught 1 for 38-yards, Noah Landi caught 1 for a 21-yard touchdown, Kale caught 2 for 12-yards, and Daigle caught 1 for 9-yards for the Squires.

The YAIAA's Division I Lions of Red Lion defeated the Division II Trojans of York Suburban 21-6. Brett Fishel led the Lions rushing attack with 133-yards (including touchdowns of 3 and 9-yards), followed by quarterback Ethan Becker with 46-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), Jake Hagan with 38-yards, Joe Ross with 11-yards, and Casey Raver with minus 14-yards. Becker completed 5 passes for 95-yards. Max Horka caught 2 passes for 62-yards, Taylor Dolan caught 2 for 21-yards, and Ross caught 1 for 12-yards for the Lions. Becker, Keith Dahlheimer, Bobby Doyle, Chris Liggitt, and Ross each had an interception and Matt Fisher had 2 sacks for the Lions. Keith Dahlheimer with 12 and Bobby Doyle with 10 led the Lions in tackles. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans rushing attack with 104-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by quarterback Joe Merkle with 62, Nathaniel Cross with 26, Asa Smith with 10, and Jordan Knaub with minus 4-yards. Merkle completed 12 passes for 86-yards. Darrius Watson caught 5 for 31-yards, Cole Wagner caught 3 for 22, Cross caught 2 for 14, Dan Johnson caught 1 for 17, and Corey Bright caught 1 for 2-yards for the Trojans.

The YAIAA's Division I Rockets of Spring Grove defeated the Division III Eagles of Bermudian Springs 34-14. Joey Rudd led the Rockets rushing attack with 68-yards (including a 43-yard touchdown), followed by Cory Baker with 51, Matt Duncan with 35, Bobby Bailey with 18, Corey Kopp with 18, quarterback Ian Smith with 12 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Caleb Burns with 3, Zach Deneen with 2-yards, Jesse Meckley with no yards, and Jeremy Frazier and Josh Nell with minus 1-yard each. Smith completed 6 passes for 57-yards and 2 touchdowns. Purnell Richardson caught 2 passes for 32-yards (including a 29-yard touchdown), Duncan caught 1 for a 10-yard touchdown, Cameron Dell caught 1 for 7, Baker caught 1 for 4, and Rudd caught 1 for 4-yards for the Rockets. The Rockets recovered 5 fumbles and had an interception to thwart the Eagles, and Austin Hull blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown for the Rockets. Sophomore Ben Golhammer rushed one time for an 84-yard

touchdown in the 4th quarter for the Eagles. Derek Mummert rushed for 55-yards, Adam Stroup for 25, Preston Green for 10-yards, and quarterback Tyler Deputy for minus 16-yards for the Eagles. Deputy completed 4 passes for 80-yards. Mummert caught 2 for 28-yards, Joe Smith caught 1 for 32-yards, and Clint Kramer caught 1 for 20-yards for the Eagles. Jeisson Lloret recovered a fumble and returned it 32-yards for a touchdown for the Eagles.

The YAIAA's Division I Bearcats of York (William Penn) shutout the Division II Warriors of Susquehannock 35-0 and are still unscored upon after three games this season. Their score for the season is 83-0 and their relentless defense has allowed just 87-yards rushing on the season. Mike Kinard led the Bearcats rushing attempt with 87-yards (including touchdowns of 7 and 18-yards), followed by Brandon Walker with 75 (including a 5-yard touchdown), Troy Smallwood with 28, quarterback Jordan Davis with 21, Wilfredo Martinez with 19, Sterling Daniels with 10, Robert Richardson with 1-yard, Stephante Doby, Ratic Drakeford and Kahlil Thompson with no yards, and John Santiago with minus 1-yard. Davis completed 5 passes for 103-yards and 2 touchdowns. Andre Callum caught 2 passes for 43-yards, Richardson caught 1 for a 28-yard touchdown, Malik Generette caught 1 for 22-yards, and Kinard caught 1 for a 10-yard touchdown for the Bearcats. A snap through the end zone resulted in a safety for the Bearcats. Corey Shelton led the Warriors rushing attack with 17-yards, followed by Mike Kelly with 8-yards, Toby Bonitz with 6, Ben Norris with 4, Jordan Robertson with 3, Drew Crane with 2, Tyler Devilbliss with 1, John Ridgeway and John Robinson with no yards, and quarterback Patrick Miller with minus 1-yard. Miller completed 5 passes for 47-yards. Kelly caught 2 for 13-yards, Billy Kerr caught 1 for 17, Jon May caught 1 for 11, and Norris caught 1 for 6-yards for the Warriors.

The YAIAA's Division III Cannons of Biglerville defeated the Division II Golden Knights of Eastern York 20-6. Jeff Foster led the Cannons rushing attack with 89-yards, followed by quarterback Kyle Whitmoyer 63-yards, Parker Showers with 2-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), and Tyrel Taughinbaugh with minus 4-yards. Whitmoyer completed 16 passes for 194-yards, 2 touchdowns and an interception for the Cannons. Zach Lieberum caught 7 passes for 74-yards (including a 14-yard touchdown), Taughinbaugh caught 4 for 46 (including a 22-yard touchdown), Mike Wagner caught 3 for 42, Showers caught 1 for 17, and Nic Lieberu caught 1 for 15-yards for the Cannons. Ian Melhorn lead the Golden Knights rushing attack with 101-yards, followed by quarterback Mike Kraft with 100-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), and Walter Lighty with 50-yards. Kraft completed 6 passes for 87-yards and Corey Hershner completed 1 for 17-yards for the Golden Knights. Melhorn caught 3 for 52-yards, Alex Seitz caught 3 for 40-yards, and Joe Giandalia caught 1 for 12-yards for the Golden Knights.

The YAIAA's Division II Fighting Irish of York Catholic defeated the Division III Knights of Fairfield 29-6. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 164-yards (including touchdowns of 16, 2 and 22-yards), followed by quarterback Chris Reagan with 37 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Frank Paolantonio with 36, and Peter Bova with 14-yards. Reagan completed 7 passes for 116-yards. John Full caught 4 passes for 98-yards, Seth Hake caught 2 for 12, and Paolantonio caught 1 pass for 6-yards for the Fighting Irish. Devin Smith led the Knights with 155-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Corey Staples with 26-yards, Travis Stambaugh with minus 3, and quarterback Aaron Sewell with minus 30-yards.

Sewell completed 2 passes for 32-yards. Smith caught 1 for 23-yards, and Keith Housel caught 1 for 9-yards for the Knights.

The YAIAA's Division II Rams of Kennard-Dale blasted the Division III Knighthawks of Hanover 35-8. Doug McClean led the Rams rushing attack with 127-yards (including touchdowns of 86 and 6-yards), followed by Mike Chenoweth with 122-yards (including a 54-yard touchdown), Jordan Senkbeil with 121-yards (including a 91-yard touchdown), quarterback Duncan Leftridge with 32-yards (including a 33-yard touchdown), and Nate Wilkinson with 2-yards. Tyler Meckley led the Knighthawks rushing attack with 57-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown). Meckley ran for 51-yards on the first play from scrimmage, but the Knighthawks were held to 42-yards rushing for the game. Zack Wentz rushed for 9-yards, Zach Wolford for minus 6-yards, and Chris Joseph for minus 18-yards. Wentz intercepted the only pass caught by anyone from Leftridge, who went 0 for 9 in the passing game for the Rams. Three different players attempted 11 passes for the Knighthawks and none were completed. The Rams also lost 5 fumbles but still rumbled to the lopsided victory.

The YAIAA's Spartans of York County Tech were shut out by the Mid-Penn's Rockets of James Buchanan 35-0. Alex Buterbaugh led the Rockets rushing attack with 143-yards (including touchdowns of 4 and 45-yards), followed by Skylar Rowe with 29-yards, and Deshane Rogers with 21-yards and a 6-yard touchdown. Jesse Smartt completed 6 passes for 73-yards and 2 touchdowns for the Rockets. Jame Hall caught 4 passes for 43-yards (including touchdowns of 12 and 15-yards), Zach Hamilton caught 1 for 19-yards and Cameron Dayley caught 1 for 11-yards for the Rockets. The Spartans were held to 48-yards rushing and 9-yards passing for the game. Quarterback Kent Weibley led the rushing attack with 48-yards, followed by Davon Talley with 15, August Jamison with 4, Angel Rodriguez with 1, and Lee Yeager with 1-yard. Three other rushers lost a combined 21-yards for the Spartans. Weibley completed 3 passes for 9-yards, all to Devin Cromedy, for the Spartans.

The Mid-Penn Colonial Division's Polar Bears of Northern York topped the Mid-Penn Keystone Division's Wildcats of Mechanicsburg 28-21. Mike Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 129-yards (including touchdowns of 4 and 16-yards), followed by Irvin Smith with 63 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Alex Potteiger with 8, quarterback Jordan Rutherford with 3, and Eddie Stephenson with 1-yard. Rutherford completed 8 passes for 143-yards and a touchdown. Robert Bleiler caught 2 passes for 50-yards (including a 44-yard touchdown), Chad Hoover caught 1 for 41-yards, Davies caught 3 for 40-yards, Smith caught 1 for 11, and Ryan Aumiller caught 1 for 1-yard. Quarterback Jake Zeigler led the Wildcats rushing attack with 48-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Erik Lewis with 6 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Matt Koveliski with 1, and Tarik Leftanant with no yards. Zeigler completed 11 passes for 147-yards and a touchdown. Ben Anderson caught 7 passes for 84-yards (including a 34-yard touchdown), Adam Tuttle caught 1 for 45-yards, and Mike Poplaski caught 2 passes for 18-yards for the Wildcats.

The Mid-Penn Keystone Division's Warriors of Gettysburg blasted the Mid-Penn Colonial Division's Bulldogs of Big Spring 38-7. Justin Jones led the Warriors rushing attack with 72-yards (including a 52-yard touchdown), followed by Cody Trail with 36 (including a 35-yard touchdown), Sean Shelleman with 16, Bernard James with 13, Josh Poorman with 7, Kyle

Gastley with 6, and David Wolfe with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Evan Lewis completed 4 of 6 passes for 167-yards and 3 touchdowns, and Randy Vaughn completed 4 passes for 18-yards for the Warriors. Jones caught 2 passes for 118-yards (including touchdowns of 70 and 48-yards), Storm Woerner caught 1 for a 32-yard touchdown, D. J. Cool caught 1 for 17-yards, Logan Riser caught 1 for 8-yards, Wolfe caught 1 for 7-yards, Mike Shultz caught 1 for 4-yards, and Dwayne Allen caught 1 for minus 1-yard for the Warriors. The explosive Warriors scored touchdowns on 4 consecutive offensive plays in the second quarter. Brian Irvin with 16, Logan Shultz with 12, and Zach Michael with 10, led the Warriors in tackles. Barton led the rushing attack for Big Spring with 85-yards, followed by T. Jumper with 37, Miller with 20, Wert with 18 (including a 17-yard touchdown), Stoudt with 17, Gantz with 16, M. Jumper with 9, Cohick with minus 1, and Etter with minus 5-yards. Etter completed 2 passes for 18-yards. T. Jumper caught 1 for 11 and Miller caught 1 for 7-yards for the Bulldogs.

Mid-Penn Keystone Division's Patriots of Red Land edged the Mid-Penn Colonial Division's Panthers of East Pennsboro 21-20. Quarterback Skylar Hunt led the Patriots rushing attack with 41-yards (including a 15-yard touchdown), followed by Junior Rodriguez with 14, Dan Yenger with 14, Scotty Acri with 7, and Carl Scheaffer with 1-yard. Hunt completed 28 passes for 352-yards and touchdowns. Teed Wertz caught 10 passes for 125-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown), Dan Klein caught 8 for 99-yards, Kyle Ostot caught 5 for 69-yards (including a 42-yard touchdown), Rodriguez caught 1 for 30-yards, Nick Leddell caught 2 for 16-yards, and Yenger caught 2 for 13-yards. Moore, with 13 tackles and 3 sacks, and Andrew Hunt, with 11 tackles and half of a sack, led the Patriots in defense. John Hostetler led the Panthers rushing attack with 144-yards, followed by Blake Wheeler with 79 (including a 60-yard touchdown), Tyler Rivera with 11, Nic Whittle with 4, Keith Wheeler with minus 1, and quarterback Wes Strayer with minus 28-yards. Strayer completed 5 passes for 41-yards and 2 touchdowns. Hostetler caught 2 for 22-yards, Brandon Nye caught 1 for a 9-yard touchdown, Keith Wheeler caught 1 for 7-yards, and Steven Carter caught 1 for a 3-yard touchdown for the Panthers. The Patriots' Dan Strayer and Aubrey Moore preserved the win as they combined to down Strayer's cousin Wes Strayer as he tried to complete a 2-point conversion pass for the Panthers for the win in overtime.
