

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Four

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division I action:

The Mustangs of South Western (1-3 overall, 0-1 league) were edged by the Wildcats of Dallastown (1-3 overall, 1-0 league) 20-17 in a thriller that saw the Wildcats break a 17-17 tie with a 18-yard Trent Bear field goal with one second left on the clock. The Wildcats gained 269-yards rushing and 40-yards passing for 309-yards of offense. Kole Kraut led the rushing attack with 20 carries for 142-yards (including touchdowns of 42 and 4-yards), followed by Kevin Frisby with 11 for 71, Matt Rae with 6 for 25, Stephen Rodriguez with 8 for 22, and Andre Le with 2 for 9-yards. Frisby completed 2 passes for 32-yards and Chris Hunt completed 1 for 8-yards for the Wildcats. Le caught 1 for 19-yards, Eric Shoff caught 1 for 13-yards, and Frisby caught 1 for 8-yards. Trent Bear kicked field goals of 32 and 18-yards. Tyler Imhoff intercepted a pass and returned it 23-yards, and Justin Zelger recovered a fumble for the Wildcats. The Mustangs gained 215-yards rushing and 41-yards passing for 256-yards of offense. Seth Barnes led the rushing attack with 6 carries for 111-yards (including a 75-yard touchdown), followed by J. R. Mummert with 17 for 86-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), John Bingham with 4 for 10-yards, Pete Kudla with 3 for 9-yards, and David Sager with 2 for minus 1-yard. Quarterback Sager completed 5 passes for 42-yards, 4 for 33-yards to Barnes and 1 for 8-yards to Marty Kefauver. Zak Kruger kicked a 33-yard field goal for the Mustangs. John Bingham led the Mustangs with 13 tackles, followed by Duane Rowlette with 12 and Zac Scott with 10. Seth Barnes has 349-yards rushing, 185-yards receiving, and 290-yards in kick returns, for a total of 824 all-purpose yards for the season for the Mustangs.

The Bearcats of William Penn of York (4-0 overall, 1-0 league) shutout the Panthers of Central York (2-2 overall, 0-1 league) 26-0. The Bearcats have not been scored upon this season and lead all opponents 115-0 after 4 games. Brandon Walker led the Bearcats rushing attack with 61-yards, followed by Mike Kinard with 36, Robert Richardson with 26, Jordan Davis with 7 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Wilfredo Martinez with 2, Nelson Torres with 1, Troy Smallwood for no yards, and Kahlil Thompson with minus 1-yard. Davis completed 15 passes for 175-yards and 3 touchdowns for the Bearcats. Malik Generett caught 4 for 56-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown), Kinard caught 3 for 47 (including a 10-yard touchdown), Andre Callum caught 2 for 32-yards, Richardson caught 3 for 22-yards, Kevin Kearse caught 1 for 12, and Joe Kennedy caught 1 for a 6-yard touchdown for the Bearcats. Carl Barnes, Andre Callum and Mike Kinard each had an interception for the Bearcats. Blaine Liggins led the Panthers rushing attack with 21-yards, followed by Tly Schildt with 8, T. J. Shaffer with 1, quarterback Brandon Workinger with minus 4, Zach Sprenkle with minus 5, L'Mar Calhoun with minus 10, and Charles Anderson with minus 13-yards. Workinger completed 9 passes for 79-yards and James Culp completed 1 for 7-yards for the Panthers. Kyle Baublitz caught 2 for 40-yards, Liggins caught 5 for 34-yards, Anderson caught 1 for 7-yards, and Ryan Wolf caught 1 for no yards for the Panthers. The Panthers netted minus 2-yards rushing and 86-yards passing for the game. Mike Anderson recovered a fumble for the Panthers.

The Rockets of Spring Grove (3-1 overall, 1-0 league) defeated the Lions of Red Lion (3-1 overall, 0-1 league) 30-14. Cory Baker led the Rockets rushing attack with 168-yards (including

a 60-yard touchdown), followed by Randy Richardson with a 62-yard touchdown, Joey Rudd with 30, Matt Duncan with 24 (including an 8-yard touchdown), quarterback Ian Smith with 13, and Caleb Burns with 8-yards. Ian Smith completed 3 passes for 49-yards, 1 to Burns for 30-yards, 1 to Josh Aikins for 13-yards, and 1 to Duncan for 6-yards for the Rockets. Andrew Polashuk returned a fumble 45-yards for a touchdown and Baker kicked a 23-yard field goal for the Rockets. Baker and Richardson each intercepted 2 passes, Rudd and Coty Slothour each had 1 interception, and Burns recovered a fumble for the Rockets. Quarterback Ethan Becker led the Lions rushing attack with 94-yards, followed by Brett Fishel with 59 (including an 18-yard touchdown), Chris Liggitt with 19, Jake Hagen with 5, Keith Dahlheimer with 1, and Joe Ross with no yards. Becker completed 10 passes for 133-yards and a touchdown for the Lions. Fishel caught 3 for 56-yards, Todd Maciejewski 2 for 31 (including a 16-yard touchdown), Max Horka 2 for 25, Taylor Dolan with 1 for 13, and Joe Ross 2 for 8-yards.

The Colonials of New Oxford (3-1 overall, 0-0 league) defeated the Division II Eagles of Dover (2-2 overall, 0-0 league) 31-14 in interdivisional action. Quarterback Ross Hall led the Colonials rushing attack with 68-yards, followed by Erik Harris with 32, Doug Black with 19 (including touchdowns of 2 and 6-yards), Tanner McNutt with 13, Jake Groft with 2-yards, and Luckenbaugh with minus 1-yard. Hall completed 14 passes for 305-yards and 2 touchdowns. Harris caught 8 passes for 189-yards (including an 85-yard touchdown), Luckenbaugh caught 5 for 75-yards (including a 46-yard touchdown), and Deven Ott caught 1 pass for 41-yards for the Colonials. Sean Patterson kicked a 20-yard field goal for the Colonials. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 62-yards, followed by Kerry Yohe with 38, Don Fahringer with 14, and Zach Paup with 8-yards. Quarterback Colt Zarilla completed 5 passes for 87-yards and 2 touchdowns for the Eagles. Hebron caught 2 passes for 48-yards, Carlos Rivera caught 1 for a 33-yard touchdown, John Miller caught 1 for 3-yards, and Yohe caught 1 for a 3-yard touchdown for the Eagles.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division II action:

The Bulldogs of West York (3-1 overall, 1-0 league) defeated the Warriors of Susquehannock (1-3 overall, 0-1 league) 26-17. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 122-yards (including touchdowns of 3 and 61-yards), followed by Alex George with 36, Dan Haverstock with 36, Chad Hinds with 7, Blake Campbell with 1, Corey Harris with minus 3, and Jay Hess with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Haverstock completed 3 passes for 65 yards and a touchdown and sophomore quarterback George (who entered the game when Haverstock was knocked out early in the game) completed 4 passes for 40-yards for the Bulldogs. Nate Jacobs caught 5 passes for 55-yards, (including a 15-yard touchdown), followed by Campbell with 1 for 40 and Blaine Fissel with 1 for 10-yards for the Bulldogs. Brandon Real also returned a kickoff 95-yards for a touchdown for the Bulldogs. Fissel, Kelly and Real each had an interception for the Bulldogs. Mike Kelly led the Warriors rushing attack with 83-yards (including touchdowns of 2 and 4-yards), followed by Corey Shelton with 44, Ben Norris with 11, Jordan Robertson with minus 1, John Ridgeway with minus 3, and quarterback Patrick Miller with minus 39-yards. Miller completed 8 passes for 89-yards. Kelly caught 2 passes for 30-yards, Norris 2 for 21, Billy Kerr 2 for 14, Shelton 1 for 17, and Josh Piermatteo 1 for 7-yards for the Warriors. Micah Collins kicked a 36-yard field goal for the Warriors.

The Fighting Irish of York Catholic (2-2 overall, 1-0 league) edged the Golden Knights of Eastern York (0-4 overall, 0-1 league) 30-28. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 78-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by quarterback Chris Reagan with 23, John Full with 12, and Frank Paolantonio with a 1-yard touchdown. Reagan completed 13 passes for 208-yards and a touchdown. Seth Hake caught 6 passes for 123-yards, followed by Full with 6 for 65-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown) and Robert Beatty with 1 for 20-yards for the Fighting Irish. Sean Obermeier kicked an 18-yard field goal and returned a kickoff 85-yards for a touchdown for the Fighting Irish. Quarterback Mike Kraft led the Golden Knights rushing attack with 103-yards (including touchdowns of 2 and 10-yards), followed by Ian Melhorn with 19 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Jared Smeltzer with 6, and Andy Seiple with 2-yards. Kraft completed 15 passes for 148-yards and a touchdown and Melhorn completed a pass for 42-yards. Alex Seitz caught 7 passes for 153-yards (including a 38-yard touchdown), followed by Joe Giandalia with 3 for 17, Melhorn with 5 for 10, and Corey Hershner with 1 for 10-yards for the Golden Knights.

The Trojans of York Suburban (2-2 overall, 1-0 league) edged the Rams of Kennard-Dale (1-3 overall, 0-1 league) 17-10. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans rushing attack with 78-yards (including touchdowns of 3 and 1-yard), followed by Asa Smith with 30, Nathaniel Cross with 18, Dan Johnson with 8, and Jordan Knaub with 2-yards. Quarterback Joe Merkle completed 5 passes for 95-yards, 3 for 34-yards to Cole Wagner, 1 for 36-yards to Johnson, and 1 for 25-yards to Cross, for the Trojans. Eric Bulgarelli kicked a 19-yard field goal for the Trojans. Quarterback Duncan Leftridge led the Rams rushing attack with 81-yards, followed by Mike Chenoweth with 48, Doug McClean with 43, Jordan Senkbeil with 34, and Zach Bacigalupa with minus 2-yards. Leftridge completed 2 passes for 20-yards and a touchdown, 1 for 19-yards and a touchdown to Jordan Shenk and 1 for a yard to McClean, for the Rams. Francis Bowman kicked a 26-yard field goal for the Rams.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division III action:

The Thunderbolts of Littlestown (2-2 overall, 1-0 league) bested the Cannons of Biglerville (2-2 overall, 0-1 league) 25-20. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts rushing attack with 227-yards (including touchdowns of 5 and 10-yards), followed by Jerrod Reynolds with 52, Tyler Fodor with 27 (including a 6-yard touchdown), and Jordon Roland with 4-yards. Reynolds completed 3 passes for 17-yards for the Squires, 1 for 9-yards to Garrett Bill, 1 for 6-yards to Matt Koontz, and 1 for 2-yards to Fodor. Jeff Foster led the Cannons rushing attack with 61-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Curt Keller with 6, and quarterback Kyle Whitmoyer with minus 15-yards. Whitmoyer completed 19 passes for 234-yards and 2 touchdowns for the Cannons. Mike Wagner caught 3 passes for 111-yards, followed by Tyrell Taughinbaugh with 7 passes for 60-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown), Zach Lieberum with 5 for 38-yards, Nic Lieberum with 2 for 14-yards (including a 9-yard touchdown), and Parker Showers with 2 for 10-yards.

The Squires of Delone Catholic (2-2 overall, 1-0 league) crushed the Knighthawks of Hanover (0-4 overall, 0-1 league) 60-6. Mike Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 138-yards (including touchdowns of 14, 5 and 42-yards), followed by Josh McNutt with 64 (including a 55-yard touchdown), Dustin Reed with 47, Brayden Daigle with 37, Thomas Tippet with 27

(including a 2-yard touchdown), Sam Comley with 20 (including a 15-yard touchdown), Noah Landi with 11 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Joseph Plummer with 9, Austin Brady with 8, Wesley Smith with 5, and Allen Neiderer with 3-yards. Landi completed 2 passes for 20-yards, 1 for 11-yards to Kale and 1 for 9-yards to Charlie Hertz, for the Squires. McNutt returned a kickoff 95-yards for a touchdown for the Squires. Chris Joseph led the Knighthawks rushing attack with 77-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Zach Wentz with 43, and quarterback Josh Livelsberger with minus 12-yards. Livelsberger completed 3 passes for 20-yards, 1 for 14-yards to Tyler Sanders, 1 for 6-yards to Zach Wolford, and 1 for no yards to Joseph for the Knighthawks. The Nighthawks were only able to garner 108-yards rushing and 20-yards passing for the game.

The Eagles of Bermudian Springs (1-3 overall, 1-0 league) routed the Spartans of York County Tech (1-3 overall, 0-1 league) 41-6. Adam Stroup led the Eagles rushing attack with 81-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Preston Green with 66, Ben Allison with 57, Derek Mummert with 39 (he made the most of that yardage with touchdowns of 1, 17, and 3-yards), Tyler Katania with 9 and Jordan Selfe with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Tyler Deputy completed 2 passes for 75-yards, 58-yards to Mummert for a touchdown and 17-yards to Stroup, for the Eagles. Jason Cline returned an interception 32-yards for a touchdown and Tyler Stambaugh returned one for 21-yards for another touchdown for the Eagles. Quarterback Kent Weibley led the Spartans rushing attack with 19-yards, followed by Dontrell Carroll with 7, Lee Yeager with 6, Davon Talley with 3-yards, Tyler Stonesiver with no yards, and Anthony Green with minus 3-yards. Weibley completed 4 passes for 25-yards, 2 for 17-yards to Carroll and 2 for 8-yards to Talley, for the Spartans, who were held to 32-yards rushing and 25-yards passing for a total offense of 57-yards for the game.

The Knights of Fairfield (1-3 overall, 0-0 league) were defeated 43-14 by the Red Raiders of Our Lady of Lourdes Regional (3-1 overall, 0-1 All-American League) in independent action. William Chesney led the Red Raiders rushing attack with 77-yards (including touchdowns of 24, and 9-yards), followed by Tyler Reichwein with 42 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Matthew Bendas with 35, Michael Bastian with 9, Martin Williams with 7, quarterback Brian Dunleavy with 1-yard (including a 3-yard touchdown), Bryan Komara with minus 1-yard and Joseph Gownley with minus 2-yards. Dunleavy completed 11 passes for 151-yards and a touchdown and Gownley completed a 3-yard touchdown pass to Jacob Lyash for the Red Raiders. David Schweitzer caught 3 passes for 37-yards, John Gilger 3 for 29, Christopher Johnson 3 for 21 (including a 9-yard touchdown), Chesney 1 for 32, Nathan Varano 1 for 32 and Lyash 1 for 3-yards for the Red Raiders. Bastian returned a punt 62-yards for a touchdown for the Red Raiders. Corey Staples led the Knights rushing attack with 21-yards, followed by Dustin Gebhart with 18, Devin Smith with 10 (before the star runner left the game with an injury in the second quarter), Derek Smith with 5, and quarterback Andrew Potts with minus 31-yards. Potts completed 4 passes for 127-yards and a touchdown and Aaron Sewell completed 4 for 56-yards and a touchdown for the Knights. Keith Housel caught 3 passes for 115-yards (including an 86-yard touchdown from Dunleavy), Cody Kuykendall caught 2 for 22-yards (including a 16-yard touchdown from Sewell), Travis Stambaugh caught 1 for 28, Matthews Haines 1 for 12, and Keifer Rogers 1 for 11-yards for the Knights.

Adams or York County Mid-Penn action:

The Warriors of Gettysburg (3-1 overall, 0-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) were defeated by the Trojans of Hershey (4-0 overall, 1-0 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 42-35 in a slugfest in overtime. Tyler Neal led the Trojans with 98-yards rushing (including touchdowns of 21 and 1-yards), followed by Pat Otey with 31, Mike Wagner with 22, and Erick Marinelli with 9-yards. Wagner completed 19 passes for 247-yards and 4 touchdowns for the Trojans. Chris Boyer caught 11 passes for 126-yards (including 38 and 7-yard touchdowns), followed by Wallace Jamison with 4 for 99-yards (including touchdowns of 53 and 21-yards), Brian Ongeri with 3 for 18, and Spencer Koppenhaver with 1 for 4-yards for the Trojans. Jamison blocked a 48-yard field goal attempt by the Warriors' Evan Lewis at the end of regulation time to force overtime. Sean Manahan led the Warriors rushing attack with 43-yards, followed by Justin Jones with 39 (including touchdowns of 2 and 2-yards), Cody Trail with 39 Including a 5-yard touchdown), D. J. Cool with 29, quarterback Evan Lewis with 24-yards and a 1-yard touchdown, and Zach Sharrah with 14-yards. Lewis completed 18 passes for 373-yards and a touchdown. Storm Woerner led the receivers with 5 for 211-yards and a 72-yard touchdown to give the Warriors a short lived lead near the end of regulation time, followed by Jones with 3 for 47, Zach Michael with 6 for 43, Manahan with 2 for 42 and Cool with 2 for 30-yards for the Warriors. Storm Woerner with 13, Tyler White with 12, Zach Michael with 11 and D. J. Cool and Justin Jones with 10 tackles each, led the Warriors defense. Manahan and Michael each had an interception for the Warriors.

The Polar Bears of Northern York (4-0 overall, 1-0 Mid Penn Colonial) romped over the Blue Devils of Green Castle-Antrim (3-1 overall, 0-1 Mid Penn Colonial) 38-7. Mike Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 165-yards (including touchdowns of 19, 10 and 19-yards), followed by Irvin Smith with 57-yards and a 6-yard touchdown, Robert James with 36, Eddie Stephenson with 21, Andrew Juba with 2-yards, Rutherford with 1-yard and Robert DeMuro with no yards. Matt Sheibley kicked a 29-yard field goal for the Polar Bears. Jordan Rutherford completed 9 passes for 167-yards and a touchdown. Robbie Bleiler led the receivers with 2 for 55-yards, followed by Davies with 3 for 47, Ryan Aumiller with 2 for 42 and a 26-yard touchdown, Hank Sanders with 1 for 22-yards and Don Bell with 1 for 1-yard for the Polar Bears. Will Cordell led the Blue Devils rushing attack with 30-yards, followed by Stephon Walker with 28, Brett Myers with 28, Adam Ritchey with 26, Brandon Trefelner with 22, Alex Izer with 16, and Benjamin Klappert with 4-yards. Myers completed 1 pass for a 25-yard touchdown to Ritchey and Ritchey completed a 9-yard pass to D. J. Cordell for the Blue Devils.

The Patriots of Red Land (4-0 overall, 1-0 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) defeated the Cougars of Palmyra (1-3 overall, 0-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 48-16. Junior Rodriguez led the Patriots rushing attack with 31-yards and a 1-yard touchdown, followed by Dan Yenger with 22-yards and a 1-yard touchdown, and Skylar Hunt with minus 17, Ryan Sherry with minus 5, Teed Wertz with minus 4-yards, and Aaron Wolaver with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Hunt completed 12 passes for 293-yards and 5 touchdowns. Wertz caught 5 passes for 109-yards (including touchdowns of 5 and 63-yards), followed by Nick Liddell with 1 for a 72-yard touchdown, Scotty Acri with 1 for a 32-yard touchdown, Ryan Scheaffer with 1 for 31-yards, Rodriguez with 1 for 24-yards, Kyle Ostot with 2 for 15-yards (including a 9-yard touchdown), and Dan Klein with 1 for 10-yards. Mike Fedor and Adam Keller each had a sack and Dan Klein recovered a fumble for the Patriots. Andy Reigle led the Cougars rushing attack with 29-yards and a 4-yard

touchdown, followed by Jared Borell with 13, Tyler Schreckengast with 7, Mike Balshy with 5, Shane Robb with 4, Zachary Stuart with 4-yards, and Adam Graybill with minus 1-yard. Mike Balshy completed 8 passes for 116-yards, Jason Rice completed 3 for 11-yards, and Borell completed 1 for 15-yards for the Cougars. Matt Johnson led the receivers with 3 for 63-yards, followed by Ryan Loy with 1 for 38, Lance Curry with 1 for 15, Reigle with 2 for 9, Borell with 1 for 6, Robb with 2 for 5, Stuart with 1 for 4, and Brendan McCoy with 1 for 2-yards. Andy Reigle with 11 and Frank Landis with 10 tackles led the Cougars defense. Matt Johnson had 2 sacks and Justin Faiola had 1. Jared Wamsher kicked a 22-yard field goal, Lance Curry returned an interception 42-yards for a touchdown, Tyler Schreckengast recovered a fumble, and Ryan Nahodil blocked a Patriots field goal attempt for the Cougars.
