

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Six

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division I action:

The Mustangs of South Western (2-4 overall, 1-2 league) were shut out by the Lions of Red Lion (4-2 overall, 1-2 league) 30-0. Quarterback Ethan Becker led the Lions rushing attack with 221-yards (including touchdowns of 57 and 42-yards, followed by Brett Fishel with 178-yards (including touchdowns of 17 and 15-yards), Jake Hagan with 42-yards, and Joe Ross with 9-yards. Becker completed 5 passes for 42-yards, 3 for 19-yards to Ross, 1 for 13-yards to Todd Maciejewski, and 1 for 8-yards to Taylor Dolan, for the Lions. The Lions also recorded a safety when the Mustangs John Bingham slipped in the end zone. J. R. Mummert led the Mustangs rushing attack with 82-yards, including runs of 44 and 26-yards with the clock winding down in an attempt to avoid the shutout, followed by Pete Kudla with 38-yards, Seth Barnes with 17-yards, John Bingham with 9-yards, Karl Maynor with 4-yards, and David Sager with 1-yard. Quarterback Sager completed 3 passes for 30-yards, 2 for 19-yards to Kudla and 1 for 11-yards to Scott Raubenstine, for the Mustangs. Blair Messenger and Drew Sneeringer each recovered a fumble and Bingham, Jordan Gall and Brandon Nicastro each recorded a sack for the Mustangs.

The Rockets of Spring Grove (4-2 overall, 2-1 league) bested the Colonials of New Oxford (3-3 overall, 0-2 league) 16-14. Matt Duncan lead the Rockets rushing attack with 56-yards (including a 9-yard touchdown), followed by Joey Rudd with 48, Cory Baker with 20 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Caleb Burns with 18, Ian Smith with 1, Randy Richardson with minus 3, and Jesse Meckley with minus 4-yards. Quarterback Smith completed 3 passes for 69-yards, 1 for 38-yards to Burns, 1 for 18-yards to Cameron Dell, and 1 for 13-yards to Rudd. Cory Baker's 18-yard field goal won the game with 43 seconds left. Brandon Markle led the Colonials rushing attack with 34-yards, followed by Erik Harris with 24, Ross Hall with 17, Jake Groft with 16, Tanner McNutt with 12, and Bobby Laughman with 4-yards. Quarterback Hall completed 10 passes for 111-yards and 2 touchdowns, 5 for 55-yards to Harris (including a 17-yard touchdown), 1 for a 26-yard touchdown to McNutt, 1 for 16-yards to Groft, 2 for 9-yards to Ryan Luckenbaugh, and 1 for 5-yards to Deven Ott, for the Rockets.

The Bearcats of William Penn of York (5-1 overall, 2-0 league) outlasted the Wildcats of Dallastown (2-4 overall, 2-1 league) 48-35. Brandon Walker led the Bearcats rushing attack with 62-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), followed by Mike Kinard with 27 (including a 13-yard touchdown), Wilfredo Martinez with 23, Jordan Davis with 15, Robert Richardson with 8, and Stephante Doby with 3-yards. Quarterback Davis completed 7 passes for 288-yards and 4 touchdowns, 2 for 102-yards to Joe Kennedy (including a 52-yard touchdown), 3 for 97-yards to Richardson (including a 37-yard touchdown), 1 for a 53-yard touchdown to Kinard, and 1 for a 36-yard touchdown to Malik Generett, for the Bearcats. Carl Barnes returned an interception 34-yards for a touchdown for the Bearcats. Kole Kraut led the Wildcats rushing attack with 95-yards (including a 6-yard touchdown), followed by Andrew Le with 86 (including touchdowns of 44 and 15-yards), Matt Rae with 7, Kevin Frisby with 0-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), and Jon Heird with minus 2-yards. Quarterback Frisby completed 14 passes for 163-yards and a touchdown, 5 for 80-yards to Eric Shoff (including a 51-yard touchdown), 4 for 38 to Le, 2 for

29 to Tyler Imhoff, 1 for 14 to Kraut, 1 for 6 to Ben Kline, and 1 for 4-yards to Heird, for the Wildcats.

The Panthers of Central York (4-2 overall, 1-1 league) defeated the Eagles of Exeter Township (0-6 overall, 0-2 Berks Inter County 1 league) 36-7 in independent action. Parrish Fells led the Panthers with 39-yards rushing (including a 10-yard touchdown), followed by Tly Schildt with 34, Brandon Workinger with 20, T. J. Shaffer with 18 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Blaine Liggins with 13, Aaron Plymire with 5, Charles Anderson with 3, Nick Petry with minus 3, and Ryan Wolf with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Workinger completed 6 passes for 56-yards, 2 for 20-yards to Wolf, 1 for 16 to Liggins, 2 for 15 to Fells, and 1 for 5-yards to Schildt, for the Panthers. Alex Kelly kicked field goals of 22 and 26-yards, D. J. Harrison blocked a punt and recovered it and returned it 4-yards for a touchdown, and L'Mar Calhoun returned a punt 55-yards for a touchdown for the Panthers. Brandon Kenney and Dylan Wanner each had an interception for the Panthers. Robert Thomas led the Eagles rushing attack with 103-yards, followed by Ronald Natale with 51, Jovan Lewis with 37, Cody Crayton with 29, Jason Pfautz with 28, Matthew Farrell with 25, and Erik Gaul with 5-yards. Quarterback Crayton completed 2 passes for 33-yards to Matthew Boyer, including a 10-yard touchdown, for the Eagles.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division II action:

The Warriors of Susquehannock (3-3 overall, 2-1 league) shutout the Rams of Kennard-Dale (1-5 overall, 0-3 league) 45-0. Corey Shelton led the Warriors rushing attack with 106-yards (including touchdowns of 8 and 1-yards), followed by Jimmy Hershey with 50 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Mike Kelly with 47 (including a 9-yard touchdown), Alex Heatwole with a 44-yard touchdown, Ben Norris with 34, Tyler Devilbiss with 29, Jordan Robertson with 12, Drew Crane with 7, Andrew Walters with 6, Toby Bonitz with 2, and quarterback Patrick Miller with minus 6-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown). Miller completed 3 passes for 43-yards, 1 for 22-yards to Josh Piermatteo, 1 for 11-yards to Robertson, and 1 for 10-yards to Billy Kerr. Micah Collins kicked a 43-yard field goal for the Warriors. Doug McClean led the Rams rushing attack with 38-yards, followed by Nate Wilkinson with 27, Mike Chenoweth with 19, Jordan Senkbeil with 13, Zach Baciagalupa with 1-yard, and Matt Romoser with minus 4-yards. Quarterback Senkbeil completed 1 pass for 29-yards to McLean for the Rams.

The Trojans of York Suburban (3-3 overall, 2-1 league) defeated the Fighting Irish of York Catholic (3-3 overall, 1-1 league) 24-3. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans with 88-yards rushing (including touchdowns of 35 and 6-yards), followed by Nathaniel Cross with 55, Asa Smith with 29 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Joe Merkle with 7, Jordan Knaub with 5, and Darrius Watson with 5-yards. Quarterback Merkle completed 3 passes for 43-yards, 1 to Dan Johnson for 24-yards, 1 to Cross for 13-yards, and 1 to Waltmyer for 6-yards, for the Trojans. Eric Bulgarelli kicked a 22-yard field goal for the Trojans. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 37-yards, followed by Chris Reagan with 20, Frank Paolantonio with 8, John Full with minus 4, and Seth Hake with minus 19-yards. Quarterback Reagan completed 9 passes for 84-yards, 4 for 49-yards to Hake, 2 for 19 to Sean Obermeier, 2 for 7 to Falci, and 1 for 9-yards to Full, for the Fighting Irish. Obermeier kicked a 27-yard field goal for the Fighting Irish.

The Bulldogs of West York (5-1 overall, 3-0 league) bested the Eagles of Dover (3-3 overall, 1-1 league) 47-35 in a slugfest. Quarterback Dan Haverstock led the Bulldog rushing attack with 196-yards and 4 touchdowns on runs of 2, 55, 5, and 79-yards, followed by Brandon Real with 148-yards and 3 touchdowns on runs of 53, 18, and 39, yards, Jay Hess with 72, Nate Jacobs with 25, Corey Harris with 17, and Alex George with minus 2-yards. Haverstock completed 2 passes for 37-yards to Jacobs for the Bulldogs. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 156-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Korry Yohe with 97-yards, Zach Paup with 21, Colt Zarilla with 15, and Mark Ball with 6-yards. Quarterback Zarilla completed 8 passes for 190-yards and 4 touchdowns, 1 for an 85-yard touchdown to John Miller, 2 for 50-yards to Hebron (including a 32-yard touchdown), 2 for 18-yards to Bryton Reaser, 1 for a 15-yard touchdown to Roger Pletcher, 1 for 14-yards to Yohe, and 1 for an 8-yard touchdown to Carlos Rivera, for the Eagles.

The Division III Eagles of Bermudian Springs (2-4 overall, 1-1 league) ran all over The Golden Knights of Eastern York (0-6 overall, 0-2 league) for a 55-7 win in independent action. Preston Green led the Eagles rushing attack with 128-yards (including touchdowns of 3, 15 and 1-yards), followed by Jeisson Lloret with 112 (including a 62-yard touchdown), Jason Cline with 56, Adam Stroup with 50 (including touchdowns of 7 and 5-yards), Quinton Gearhart with 8, Tyler Deputy with 7, Ben Allison with 5, Tyler Catania with 3, Michael Megonnell with 3, and Reese Seekford with 2-yards. Quarterback Deputy completed 3 passes for 63-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 37-yards to Clint Kramer (including a 22-yard touchdown) and 1 for 26-yards to Joe Smith, for the Eagles. Ian Melhorn led the Golden Knights rushing attack with 5-yards, followed by Andy Seiple with 4, Mike Kraft with 3, Aaron Meckley with 0-yards, and Wes Rockwell with minus 19-yards, as the Golden Knights were held to a minus 7-yards rushing for the game. Quarterback Kraft completed 9 passes for 179-yards and a touchdown, 6 for 152-yards to Joe Giandalia (including a 80-yard touchdown), 2 for 20-yards to Melhorn, and 1 for 7-yards to Alex Seitz, for the Golden Knights.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division III action:

The Thunderbolts of Littlestown (3-3 overall, 2-1 league) defeated the Knights of Fairfield (2-4 overall, 1-1 league) 53-24. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts 290-yard rushing attack with 117-yards (including touchdowns of 32, 1, and 40-yards), followed by Josh Bucher with 77 (including a 64-yard touchdown), Tyler Fodor with 51, Jerrod Reynolds with 22, John Clines with 7, Thomas Senseney with 7, Brandin Worley with 6, and Jordon Rolin with 4-yards. Quarterback Reynolds completed 10 passes for 216-yards and 4 touchdowns, 1 for a 74-yard touchdown to Chris Tully, 2 for 60-yards to Matt Koontz (including a 27-yard touchdown), 4 for 45-yards to Justin Emig (including touchdowns of 27 and 4-yards), 2 for 31-yards to Garrett Bill, and 1 for 6-yards to Beaver, for the Thunderbolts. Cory Beaver and Evan Bowers each had an interception, Andrew Stevenson and Zack Zeitler each had 2 sacks, and Adam Coslett had a sack for the Thunderbolts. Dustin Gebhart led the Knights rushing attack with 55-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown), followed by Thomas Myers with 50, Travis Stambaugh with 41, Derek Smith with 23 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Josh Cornish with a 16-yard touchdown, Corey Staples with 11, Andrew Potts with minus 4, and Aaron Sewell with minus 17-yards. Quarterback Sewell completed 6 passes for 58-yards, 2 for 27-yards to Cody Kuykendall, 2 for

18-yards to Ryan Schultz, 1 for 9-yards to Stambaugh, and 1 for 4-yards to Keifer Rogers, for the Knights.

The Squires of Delone Catholic (4-2 overall, 3-0 league) blasted the Cannons of Biglerville (3-3 overall, 1-2 league) 47-21. Mike Kale led the Squires with 135-yards rushing (including touchdowns of 28, 3 and 2-yards), followed by Josh McNutt with 96 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Tommy Tippet with 52 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Dusty Reed with 39, Wes Smith with 8, Noah Landi with 5 (including a 6-yard touchdown), and Brayden Daigle with minus 3-yards. Quarterback Landi completed 3 passes for 79-yards, 2 for 66-yards to Chris Burton and 1 for 13-yards to Reed, for the Squires. Reed returned the opening kickoff 79-yards for a touchdown for the Squires, who never looked back. With leading rusher Jeffrey Foster out with an injury early in the game, Parker Showers led the Cannons with 77-yards rushing, followed by Tyrel Taughinbaugh with 19 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Brice Leonard with 13, Nic Lieberum with 12, Nick Asper with 3-yards, Foster with 1, and quarterback Kyle Whitmoyer with 1-yard. Whitmoyer completed 9 passes for 119-yards and 2 touchdowns, 3 for 63-yards to Nic Lieberum (including a 31-yard touchdown), 3 for 21-yards to Taughinbaugh, 2 for 33-yards to Mike Wagner, and 1 for a 2-yard touchdown to Zach Lieberum, for the Cannons.

The Knighthawks of Hanover (1-5 overall, 1-2 league) defeated the Spartans of York County Tech (1-5 overall, 0-2 league) 19-13. Chris Joseph led the Knighthawks rushing attack with 117-yards (including a 47-yard touchdown), followed by Tyler Meckley with 110-yards (including touchdowns of 1 and 2-yards), Zach Wentz with 25-yards, and Joe Null with 23, and Josh Livelsberger with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Livelsberger completed 1 pass for 14-yards to Zach Wolford for the Knighthawks. Dontrell Carroll led the Spartans rushing attack with 57-yards, followed by Tyler Stonesifer with 49, Davon Talley with 17, Trevor Smallwood with 16, Jerynnie Stonier with minus 1, Kent Weibley with minus 2, and DeJon O'Conner with minus 4-yards. Weibley completed 1 pass for a 22-yard touchdown to Smallwood for the Spartans. Carroll returned a kickoff 76-yards for a touchdown for the Spartans.

Adams or York County Mid-Penn action:

The Patriots of Red Land (6-0 overall, 3-0 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) defeated the Falcons of Lower Dauphin (3-3 overall, 2-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 27-7. Chad Christen kicked field goals of 46 and 50-yards for the Patriots. Junior Rodriguez led the Patriots rushing attack with 72-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), followed by Dan Yenger with 57, Teed Wertz with 7, Carl Scheaffer with 6, Scotty Acri with 4, and quarterback Skylar Hunt with 3-yards. Hunt completed 10 passes for 108-yards and 2 touchdowns, 2 to Nick Liddell for 39-yards, 3 for 32 to Kyle Ostot, 2 for 23 to Wertz (including touchdowns of 12 and 11-yards), 1 for 6 to Ryan Scheaffer, 1 for 5 to Dan Klein, and 1 for 3 to Rodriguez, for the Patriots. Rodriguez and Scheaffer each recovered a fumble, Klein and Yenger each had an interception, and Jared Erdman, Chris Hull and Max Liddell each recorded a sack for the Patriots. Jordan Rosario scored a touchdown on a 1-yard run and Jaratt Dill kicked the extra point for the Falcons. No other information was available regarding the Falcons accomplishments.

The Warriors of Gettysburg (5-1 overall, 2-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) shutout the Cougars of Palmyra (1-5 overall, 0-3 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 55-0. Sean Shelleman led the

Warriors rushing attack with 45-yards (including a 18-yard touchdown), followed by Cody Trail with 28 (including a 18-yard touchdown), Zach Sharrah with 27 (including touchdowns of 12 and 1-yards), Justin Jones with 24, Dwayne Allen with 8, A. J. Acevedo with 4, and Kyle Gastley with 2-yards. Quarterback Evan Lewis completed 6 passes for 181-yards and 3 touchdowns, 2 for 82-yards to Zach Michael (including a 42-yard touchdown), 1 for a 52-yard touchdown to Jones, 1 for a 46-yard touchdown to Trail, and 1 each to Sean Manahan and Storm Woerner for no yards, for the Warriors. Bernard James returned the second half kickoff 81-yards for a touchdown for the Warriors. Jon Holz and Jones each had a sack, Zach Michael had an interception, and Tyler White blocked a punt for the Warriors. Jared Borell led the Cougars rushing attack with 19-yards, followed by Zachary Stuart with 18, Jason Rice with 12, Lance Curry with 8, Andy Reigle with 3, Maxwell Hess with 2-yards, Mike Balshy with minus 3, and Shane Robb and Nana Saahene with minus 5-yards each. Balshy completed 4 passes for 57-yards, 2 for 35-yards to Matt Johnson and 2 for 22-yards to Curry, and Rice completed 1 pass for 1-yard to Christopher Pavone for the Cougars. Curry returned an interception 30-yards for the Cougars.

The Polar Bears of Northern York (6-0 overall, 2-0 Mid Penn Colonial) and the Black Panthers of Milton (0-6 overall, 0-2 Central Susquehanna 1 League) 62-20 in independent action. Michael Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 300-yards (including 6 touchdowns on runs of 78, 45, 81, 6, 25, and 5-yards). Dustin Miller scored 2 touchdowns on runs of 3 and 58-yards and Eddie Stephenson returned a kickoff 70-yards for a touchdown for the Polar Bears. Brandon Bower returned a fumble 35-yards for a touchdown, Bud Kurtz scored a touchdown on a 9-yard run, and Shane McCauley scored a touchdown on a 20-yard run for the Black Panthers.
