

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Seven

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division I action:

The Mustangs of South Western (2-5 overall, 1-3 league) were defeated by the Panthers of Central York (5-2 overall, 2-1 league) 42-13. Parrish Fells led the Panthers rushing attack with 89-yards (including a 43-yard touchdown), followed by Tly Schildt with 80 (including a 10-yard touchdown), T. J. Shaffer with 33 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Ryan Wolf with 21, Aaron Plymire with 3, Charles Anderson with 0-yards, and Brandon Workinger with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Workinger completed 9 passes for 151-yards and 2 touchdowns, 2 for 90-yards to Wolf (including a 60-yard touchdown), 2 for 23-yards to Fells, 3 for 20-yards to Liggins, 1 for a 19-yard touchdown to Nick Petry, and 1 for minus 1-yard to Kyle Baublitz, for the Panthers. James English returned a fumble 12-yards for a touchdown for the Panthers. The Panthers also recorded a safety when David Abror tackled Seth Barnes in the end zone. L'Mar Calhoun and Joe Munchel each intercepted a pass and James English, Calhoun and Munchel each recovered a fumble for the Panthers. Barnes led the Mustangs rushing attack with 28-yards, followed by J. R. Mummert with 22-yards, John Bingham with 7-yards, Zac Scott with 7-yards, and David Sager with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Sager completed 8 passes for 93-yards and a touchdown, 3 for 64-yards to Marty Kefauver (including a 38-yard touchdown), 1 for 9-yards to Drew Sneeringer, 1 for 8-yards to Cody Mundorff, 1 for 5-yards to Barnes, 1 for 5-yards to Bingham, and 1 for 2-yards to Chris Helwig, for the Mustangs. Barnes also returned a kickoff 85-yards for a touchdown for the Mustangs. Andrew Sells had a sack, Barnes was credited with 2 pass defenses, and Duane Rowlette and Karl Maynor were each credited with a pass defense for the Mustangs.

The Lions of Red Lion (5-2 overall, 2-2 league) edged the Colonials of New Oxford (3-4 overall, 0-3 league) 29-27. Brett Fishel led the Lions rushing attack with 105-yards, followed by Ethan Becker with 48 (including 5 and 1-yard touchdowns), Jake Hagan with 30 (including a 10-yard touchdown), and Joe Ross with 15-yards. Quarterback Becker completed 8 passes for 128-yards and a touchdown, 3 for 55-yards to Fishel, 2 for 39-yards to Todd Maciejewski, 1 for 31-yards to Taylor Dolan, and 1 for a 3-yard touchdown to Hagan, for the Lions. Becker kicked 2 extra points and a 22-yard field goal for the Lions. Brandon Markle led the Colonials rushing attack with 43-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Erik Harris with a 42-yard touchdown, Ross Hall with 41, Nick Rebert with 0-yards, and Ryan Luckenbaugh with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Hall completed 10 passes for 161-yards and 2 touchdowns, 2 for 61-yards to Harris, 2 for 46-yards to Adam Rudisill (including a 18-yard touchdown), 4 for 38-yards to Luckenbaugh (including a 10-yard touchdown), 1 for 12-yards to John Watz, and 1 for 4-yards to Jake Groft, for the Colonials. Sean Patterson kicked 3 extra points and a 2-point conversion pass failed for the other attempt for the Colonials.

The Bearcats of William Penn of York (6-1 overall, 3-0 league) defeated the Rockets of Spring Grove (4-3 overall, 2-2 league) 38-14. Brandon Walker led the Bearcats rushing attack with 52-yards, followed by Mike Kinard with 37 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Wilfredo Martinez with 25, Jordan Davis with 20, and Robert Richardson with 12-yards (including a 16-yard touchdown). Quarterback Davis completed 12 passes for 232-yards and 3 touchdowns (he now

has 1,100-yards and 14 touchdowns on the season), 2 for 78-yards to Malik Generrett (including a 12-yard touchdown), 3 for 75-yards to Richardson, 3 for 31-yards to Andre Callum (including a 10-yard touchdown), 3 for 23-yards to Kinard (including a 17-yard touchdown), and 1 for 25-yards to Carl Barnes, for the Bearcats. Barnes also returned a fumble 15-yards for a touchdown for the Bearcats. A 2-point conversion pass from Davis to Generrett was the only successful extra point attempt for the Bearcats. Joey Rudd led the Rockets rushing attack with 34-yards, followed by Cory Baker with 30, Matt Duncan with 23, Purnell Richardson with 0, and Ian Smith with minus 18-yards. Quarterback Smith completed 5 passes for 124-yards and 2 touchdowns, 3 for 78-yards to Caleb Burns (including a 62-yard touchdown), and 2 for 46-yards to Duncan (including a 46-yard touchdown), for the Rockets. Baker kicked the 2 extra points for the Rockets.

The Wildcats of Dallastown (3-4 overall, 2-1 league) edged the Division II Trojans of York Suburban (3-4 overall, 2-1 league) 14-7 in independent action. Kole Kraut led the Wildcats rushing attack with 147-yards, followed by Jon Heird with 64, Matt Rae with 64 (including a 5-yard touchdown), quarterback Kevin Frisby with 26 (including 69-yards on 5 carries and a 1-yard touchdown in the game winning 90-yard drive), Andrew Le with 12, and Dan Blasingame with 5-yards. Frisby completed 3 passes for 19-yards, 13-yards to Zachary Green, 7-yards to Ben Kline, and minus a yard to Le, for the Wildcats. Cody Waltmyer led the Trojans rushing attack with 55-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Nathan Cross with 30, quarterback Joe Merkle with 16, Tyler Knaub with 15, Asa Smith with 2-yards, and Marino Glover with minus 1-yard. Merkle completed 10 passes for 105-yards, 3 for 34-yards to Dan Johnson, 2 for 28-yards to Darrius Watson, 3 for 26-yards to Cole Wagner, and 2 for 17-yards to Cross, for the Trojans.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division II action:

The Warriors of Susquehannock (4-3 overall, 3-1 league) defeated the Eagles of Dover (3-4 overall, 1-2 league) 38-28. Mike Kelley, with 243-yards from scrimmage, led the Warriors rushing attack with 142-yards, followed by Corey Shelton with 81 (including a 15-yard touchdown), Ben Norris with 24, and Patrick Miller with 19. Quarterback Miller completed 7 passes for 138-yards and 4 touchdowns, 3 for 101-yards to Kelly (including touchdowns of 6 and 75-yards), 3 for 34-yards to Shelton (including a 4-yard touchdown), and 1 for a 3-yard touchdown to Norris, for the Warriors. Micah Collins kicked 5 extra points and a 31-yard field goal for the Warriors. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 105-yards (including a 71-yard touchdown), followed by Colt Zarilla with 83 (including touchdowns of 10, 25, and 47-yards), Dan Fahringer with 39, Korry Yohe with 7, Zach Paup with 4, and Mark Ball with 4-yards. Quarterback Zarilla completed 9 passes for 87-yards, 2 for 27-yards to Bryton Reaser, 2 for 26-yards to Andy Wolfgang, 3 for 17-yards to Hebron, 1 for 9-yards to Carlos Rivera, and 1 for 8-yards to John Miller, for the Eagles. Zarilla also kicked 4 extra points for the Eagles.

The Bulldogs of West York (6-1 overall, 4-0 league) pounded the Fighting Irish of York Catholic (3-4 overall, 1-2 league) 42-10. Dan Haverstock led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 84-yards (including a 2-yard touchdown), followed by Brandon Real with 83 (including a 36-yard touchdown), Jay Hess with 43, Corey Harris with 37, Skyler Heath with 21 (including a 15-yard touchdown), Tom Ort with 18, Nate Jacobs with minus 7, and Alex George with minus 16-yards.

Quarterback Haverstock completed 2 passes for 40-yards and 2 touchdowns, a 24-yard touchdown to Jacobs and a 16-yard touchdown to Blake Campbell, for the Bulldogs. Real also returned a punt 55-yards for a touchdown for the Bulldogs. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 84-yards, followed by Dan Starceski with 3, Peter Bova with 2, Frank Paolantonio with 0, and Chris Reagan with minus 23-yards. Quarterback Reagan completed 9 passes for 119-yards and a touchdown, 3 for 50-yards to Sean Obermeier, 4 for 34-yards to Seth Hake, 1 for a 30-yard touchdown to John Full, and 1 for 5-yards to Paolantonio, for the Fighting Irish. Obermeier also kicked a 32-yard field goal for the Fighting Irish.

The Golden Knights of Eastern York (1-6 overall, 1-2 league) edged the Rams of Kennard-Dale (1-6 overall, 0-4 league) 27-24 for their first victory of the year. Ian Melhorn led the Golden Knights rushing attack with 137-yards (including a 64-yard touchdown), followed by Mike Kraft with 89 (including touchdowns of 1, 30 and 1-yards), Aaron Meckley with 38, Wes Rockwell with 16, and Andy Seiple with 10-yards. Quarterback Kraft completed 8 passes for 80-yards, 5 for 45-yards to Melhorn, 2 for 23-yards to Joe Giandalia, and 1 for 12-yards to Seiple, for the Golden Knights. Drake Dunlap intercepted a Rams pass to seal the victory for the Golden Knights. Duncan Leftridge led the Rams rushing attack with 120-yards (including touchdowns of 4 and 57-yards), followed by Mike Chenoweth with 48, Jordan Senkbeil with 20, and Doug McClean with 20-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown). Quarterback Leftridge completed 4 passes for 101-yards, 2 for 46-yards to McClean, 1 for 46-yards to Senkbeil, and 1 for 9-yards to Brad Wilson, for the Rams. Francis Bowman kicked a 32-yard field goal for the Rams.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division III action:

The Thunderbolts of Littlestown (4-3 overall, 3-1 league) blasted the Spartans of York County Tech (1-6 overall, 0-3 league) 53-20. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts rushing attack with 173-yards (including 5 touchdowns on runs of 35, 9, 7, 12, and 33-yards), followed by Tyler Fodor with 8, Thomas Senseney with 1, Brandin Worley with a 1-yard touchdown, Jordon Rolon with 0, Matt Koontz with 0, Jerrod Reynolds with minus 3, Josh Bucher with minus 5, and Jon Clines with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Reynolds completed 10 passes for 162-yards and a touchdown, Matt Zuber completed 2 passes for 41-yards, and Jon Clines completed 1 for a 40-yard touchdown, for the Thunderbolts. Garrett Bill caught 6 passes for 87-yards (including a 15-yard touchdown pass from Reynolds), Kevin Gibson caught 2 for 72-yards (including a 40-yard touchdown pass from Clines), Beaver caught 2 for 35-yards, Ryan Wickline caught 2 for 27-yards, and Koontz caught 1 for 22-yards, for the Thunderbolts. Tyler Stonesifer led the Spartans rushing attack with 77-yards, followed by Kent Weibley with 30, Dontrell Carroll with 23 (including a 9-yard touchdown), Davon Talley with 23 (including a 13-yard touchdown), Ryan Zink with 11, and Trevor Smallwood with minus 7-yards. Quarterback Weibley completed 1 pass for 20-yards to Carroll. Carroll also returned an interception 52-yards for a touchdown for the Spartans.

The Squires of Delone Catholic (5-2 overall, 4-0 league) defeated the Eagles of Bermudian Springs (2-5 overall, 1-2 league) 32-7. Michael Kale led the Squires with 89-yards rushing (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Joshua McNutt with 67, Dustin Reed with 33 (including touchdowns of 6 and 14-yards), Wesley Smith with 31, Brayden Daigle with 23 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Thomas Tippet with 5, Todd Berry with 0, Noah Landi with

minus 2, and Sam Comly with minus 4-yards. Quarterback Landi completed 2 passes for 32-yards, 1 for 20-yards to Nick Hoddinott and 1 for 12-yards to Daigle, for the Squires. Daigle also returned an interception 91-yards for a touchdown for the Squires. Jeisson Lloret led the Eagles rushing attack with 94-yards, followed by Adam Stroup with 60 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Derek Mummert with 39, Preston Green with 30, Mitch Highlands with 2, and Tyler Deputy with minus 25-yards. Quarterback Deputy completed 3 passes for 40-yards, 1 for 27-yards to Mummert, 1 for 8-yards to Jason Cline, and 1 for 5-yards to Stroup, for the Eagles.

The Cannors of Biglerville (4-3 overall, 2-2 league) romped over the Knights of Fairfield (2-5 overall, 1-2 league) 40-8. Kyle Whitmoyer led the Cannors rushing attack with 112-yards (including touchdowns of 2, 14, and 55-yards), followed by Parker Showers with 63-yards (including touchdowns of 2 and 9-yards), Brice Leonard with 28, Tyrel Taughinbaugh with 15, Tom McMaster with 10, Nick Asper with 6, Zach Campo with 1, and Ben Foster with 1-yard. Quarterback Whitmoyer completed 6 passes for 83-yards, 4 for 50-yards to 1 for 23-yards to Showers, and 1 for 10-yards to Zach Lieberum. Lieberum also returned an interception 45-yards for a touchdown for the Cannors. Dustin Gebhart led the Knights rushing attack with 70-yards, followed by Corey Staples with 50, Ryan Schultz with 15, Aaron Sewell with 6, Keifer Rogers with 2-yards, and Travis Stambaugh with 1-yard. Quarterback Sewell completed 8 passes for 105-yards and a touchdown, and Rogers completed 1 pass for 34-yards for the Knights. Staples caught 3 passes for 31-yards, Stambaugh caught 1 for 34-yards, Rogers caught 1 for a 25-yard touchdown, Cody Kuykendall caught 1 for minus 1-yard, and Keith House caught 1 for minus 7-yards, for the Knights. House also caught a 2-point conversion pass from Sewell for the Knights.

The Nighthawks of Hanover (1-6 overall, 1-2 league) lost to the Twin Valley League's Buffaloes of Newport (3-4 overall, 1-4 league) 35-14 in independent action. Cole Benner led the Buffaloes rushing attack with 141-yards (including touchdowns of 9 and 1-yards), followed by Eric Robinson with 91 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Jared Seaman with 72, Cody Campbell with 20, Andrew Rhoads with 16, Mike Hogan with a 1-yard touchdown, and Ethan Pellman with minus 1-yard (including a 3-yard touchdown). Quarterback Pellman completed 4 passes for 84-yards, 3 for 54-yards to Matt Lehman and 1 for 30-yards to Ethan Dobyms, for the Buffaloes. Joe Null led the Knighthawks rushing attack with 28-yards, followed by Chris Joseph with 20, Zack Wentz with 17 (including a 10-yard touchdown), Tyler Meckley with 11, Josh Livelsberger with minus 3, and Dylan Caler with minus 7-yards. Quarterback Livelsberger completed 3 passes for 13-yards, 2 for 9-yards to Jonathan Osladil and 1 for 4-yards to Wentz, for the Knighthawks. Null returned a kickoff 80-yards for a touchdown for the Knighthawks.

Adams or York County Mid-Penn action:

The Patriots of Red Land (7-0 overall, 4-0 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) edged the Indians of Susquehanna Township (3-4 overall, 1-3 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 21-14. Dan Yenger led the Patriots rushing attack with 211-yards (including a 53-yard touchdown), followed by Scotty Acri with 38, Skylar Hunt with 4 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Nicco Faris with a 2-yard touchdown, and Junior Rodriguez with 2-yards. Quarterback Hunt completed 4 passes for 34-yards, 3 for 28-yards to Kyle Ostot and 1 for 6-yards to Acri, for the Patriots. Quarterback Ben Dupree completed a 69-yard touchdown pass to Gabe Oliver and a 10-yard touchdown pass to

Josh Headen, and Carlin Carter kicked both extra points, for the Indians. No other information was available regarding the Indians accomplishments.

The Warriors of Gettysburg (5-2 overall, 3-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) romped over the Wildcats of Mechanicsburg (2-5 overall, 0-4 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) 49-7. Justin Jones led the Warriors with 131-yards rushing (including touchdowns of 1, 54, and 8-yards), followed by Cody Trail with 82, Evan Lewis with 20, Zach Sharrah with 16, and Dwayne Allen with 4-yards. Quarterback Lewis completed 9 passes for 89-yards and 2 touchdowns, 3 for 36-yards to Storm Woerner (including a 17-yard touchdown), 2 for 19-yards to Jones (including a 21-yard touchdown), 1 for 15-yards to Sean Manahan, 1 for 10-yards to Tyler White, and 2 for 9-yards to Zach Michael, for the Warriors. Trevon Johnson returned an interception 14-yards for a touchdown, Brian Irvin returned an interception 23-yards for a touchdown, and Randy Vaughn had an interception for the Warriors. Lewis kicked all 7 extra points for the Warriors. Tarik Leftenant led the Wildcats rushing attack with 29-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown that he set up with a 54-yard punt return), followed by Erik Lewis with 15, Eliut Castranio with 14, Nik Cremo with 9, Kennedy Nye with 3-yards, and Jake Zeigler with minus 4-yards. Zeigler completed 3 passes for 5-yards and a touchdown, Nye completed 1 for 17-yards, and Mike Poplaski completed 1 for 4-yards for the Wildcats. Matthew Martin caught 1 pass for 17-yards, Ben Anderson 2 for 7-yards, Leftenant 1 for 4-yards and a touchdown, and Matt Morell 1 for minus 2-yards for the Wildcats. Anderson kicked the extra point for the Wildcats.

The Polar Bears of Northern York (7-0 overall, 3-0 Mid Penn Colonial) crushed the Bulldogs of Big Spring (0-7 overall, 0-4 Mid Penn Colonial) 55-3. Michael Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 5 touchdowns on runs of 23, 9, 1, 21 and 2-yards (he has 21 rushing touchdowns for the season). Bubba Smith scored on an 11-yard run, Dustin Miller scored on an 8-yard run, and Jordan Rutherford threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Aumiller for the Polar Bears. Josh Durham kicked a 23-yard field goal with 2:57 left in the game for the Bulldogs to avoid a shutout. No other information about this game was available.
