

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Ten

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division I action:

The Mustangs of South Western (3-7 overall, 1-5 league) defeated the Division III Squires of Delone Catholic (7-3 overall, 6-0 league) 17-10 in independent action. Seth Barnes led the Mustangs rushing attack with 88-yards (including a 22-yard touchdown), followed by Karl Maynor with 30-yards, Chris Helwig with 26-yards, John Bingham with 18-yards, Zac Scott with 17-yards, and Pete Kudla with 2-yards. The team lost 25-yards on a bad snap. Quarterback David Sager completed 6 passes for 65-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 37-yards to Drew Sneeringer (including a 16-yard touchdown), 1 for 18-yards to Bingham, 2 for 10-yards to Marty Kefauver, and 1 for no yards to Maynor, for the Mustangs. Zac Kruger kicked 2 extra points and a 35-yard field goal, Barnes and Duane Rowlette each had a big interception, Andrew Sells recovered a fumble, Rowlette had 10 tackles, and Zach Hagerman, Josh Rummel and Brandon Nicastro each recorded a sack for the Mustangs. Michael Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 128-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), followed by Dustin Reed with 61-yards, Joshua McNutt with 28-yards, Noah Landi with minus 2-yards, Christopher Burton with minus 7-yards, and Brayden Daigle with minus 8-yards. Quarterback Landi completed 2 passes for 68-yards, 1 for 40-yards to Charlie Hertz and 1 for 28-yards to Daigle, and threw 2 interceptions, for the Squires. Miles Moore kicked an extra point and a 32-yard field goal for the Squires. The number 6 seeded Squires visit the number 3 seeded Crimson Tide of Columbia Friday night in the class AA District 3 playoffs.

The Bearcats of William Penn of York (9-1 overall, 6-0 league) defeated the Colonials of New Oxford (4-6 overall, 1-5 league) 49-24 to win the Division title outright. The number 4 seeded Bearcats will host the number 13 seeded Wildcats of Dallastown Friday night in the first round of the class AAAA District 3 Playoffs. Mike Kinard led the Bearcats rushing attack with 176-yards (including touchdowns of 36 and 74-yards), followed by Stephante Doby with 80 (including a 63-yard touchdown), Brandon Walker with 47 (including touchdowns of 6 and 11-yards), Robert Richardson with 9, Kahil Thompson with 1, Jordan Davis with a 1-yard touchdown, and Wilfredo Martinez with no yards. Quarterback Davis completed 7 passes for 139-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 54-yards to Richardson (including a 52-yard touchdown), 3 for 41-yards to Malik Generett, 1 for 34-yards to Kinard, and 1 for 11-yards to Andre Callum, for the Bearcats. Ross Hall led the Colonials rushing attack with 75-yards, followed by Tanner McNutt with 19, Brandon Markle with 12 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Ryan Luckenbaugh with 9, Bobby Laughman with 1, and Brian Lawrence with minus 2-yards. Quarterback Hall completed 20 passes for 223-yards and a touchdown, 7 for 73-yards to Erik Harris, 5 for 56-yards to Luckenbaugh (including a 19-yard touchdown), 4 for 45-yards to Jake Groft, 3 for 39-yards to Deven Ott, and 1 for 10-yards to T. J. Hartlaub, for the Colonials. Sean Patterson kicked a 24-yard field goal for the Colonials.

The Panthers of Central York (7-3 overall, 4-2 league) mauled the Rockets of Spring Grove (4-6 overall, 2-4 league) 38-13. The number 11 seeded Panthers will visit the number 6 seeded Crusaders of Bishop McDevitt Saturday afternoon in the class AAAA District 3 playoffs. Tly Schildt led the Panthers rushing attack with 77-yards (including a 23-yard touchdown), followed

by Parrish Fells with 22, T. J. Shaffer with 18 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Charles Anderson with 13, Blaine Liggins with 6, Aaron Plymire with 4, and Brandon Workinger with minus 3-yards. Quarterback Workinger completed 8 passes for 173-yards and 3 touchdowns, 2 for 95-yards to Ryan Wolf (including touchdowns of 60 and 35-yards), 1 for 31-yards to James Culp, 4 for 29-yards to Liggins (including a 10-yard touchdown), and 1 for 18-yards to Schildt, for the Panthers. Alex Kelly kicked a 24-yard field goal, L'Mar Calhoun had 2 interceptions (which he returned for a total of 46-yards), and Seth Shoemaker and Tory Wagner each recovered a fumble for the Panthers. Joey Rudd led the Rockets rushing attack with 36-yards, followed by Matt Duncan with 18, Cory Baker with 6, Caleb Burns with minus 3, and Jesse Meckley with minus 19-yards. Quarterback Meckley completed 1 pass for 25-yards to Burns for the Rockets. Purnell Richardson returned a punt 59-yards for a touchdown and he returned an interception 96-yards for a touchdown for the Rockets.

The Wildcats of Dallastown (6-4 overall, 5-1 league) edged the Lions of Red Lion (6-4 overall, 2-4 league) shutout 22-21 in overtime with a gutsy fake extra point kick and a 2-point conversion pass from Chris Hunt to Justin Bull. The number 13 seeded Wildcats will visit the number 4 seeded Bearcats of William Penn Friday night in the first round of the class AAAA District 3 Playoffs. The number 15 seeded Lions will visit the number 2 seeded Blue Streaks of Manheim Township Friday night in the first round of the class AAAA District 3 Playoffs. Kole Kraut led the Wildcats rushing attack with 80-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), followed by Jon Heird with 68, Kevin Frisby with 39 (including touchdowns of 2 and 1-yards), Matt Rae with 33, and Andrew Le with 16-yards. Quarterback Frisby completed 7 passes for 68-yards, 2 for 40-yards to Eric Shoff, 3 for 17-yards to Heird, 1 for 8-yards to Le, and 1 for 3-yards to Ben Kline, for the Wildcats. Brett Fishel led the Lions rushing attack with 126-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), followed by Ethan Becker with 23 (including touchdowns of 4 and 10-yards), Jon Smith with 23, and Joe Ross with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Becker completed 6 passes for 68-yards, 2 for 21-yards to Max Horoka, 2 for 17-yards to Fishel, 1 for 20-yards to Taylor Dolan, and 1 for 9-yards to Ross, for the Lions. Casey Raver and Bobby Doyle each had an interception for the Lions.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division II action:

The Warriors of Susquehannock (6-4 overall, 5-1 league) defeated the Trojans of York Suburban (4-6 overall, 3-3 league) 49-13 to win the Division title outright. The number 5 seeded Warriors will host the number 12 seeded Blue Devils of Greencastle-Antrim in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. Mike Kelly led the Warriors rushing attack with 116-yards (including a 59-yard touchdown), followed by Corey Shelton with 90 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Ben Norris with 15 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Jimmy Hershey with 23 (including an 8-yard touchdown), Patrick Miller with 10, Toby Bonitz with 1, Drew Crane with minus 2, and Andrew Walters with minus 8-yards. Quarterback Miller completed 5 passes for 115-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 57-yards to Kelly (including a 44-yard touchdown), 2 for 49-yards to Norris, and 1 for 9-yards to Shelton, for the Warriors. Shelton returned a kickoff 93-yards for a touchdown and Josh Piermatteo returned an interception 25-yards for a touchdown for the Warriors. Asa Smith led the Trojans rushing attack with 40-yards, followed by Nathaniel Cross with 33, Joseph Merkle with 15, Jordan Knaub with 11, Quentin Allen with 8, Stanley Williams with minus 1, and Nicolas Simon with minus 9-yards. Quarterback Merkle completed 12 passes

for 207-yards and 2 touchdowns, Knaub completed 1 for 32-yards, and Sean Hinnenkamp completed 1 for 15-yards for the Trojans. Dan Johnson caught 4 passes for 106-yards (including a 33-yard touchdown, followed by Cole Wagner with 3 for 48-yards, Michael King with 2 for 45-yards, Nathaniel Cross with a 20-yard touchdown catch, Roland Boyer with 1 for 15-yards, and Darrius Watson with 2 for 12-yards, for the Trojans.

The Bulldogs of West York (9-1 overall, 6-0 league) blasted the Golden Knights of Eastern York (1-9 overall, 1-5 league) 42-14. The number 5 seeded Bulldogs will host the number 12 seeded Golden Mules of Solanco Friday night in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 199-yards (including a 32-yard touchdown), followed by Dan Haverstock with 96 (including a 57-yard touchdown), Jay Hess with 49 (including a 24-yard touchdown), Skyler Heath with 4, Corey Harris with minus 4, and Blake Campbell with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Haverstock completed 5 passes for 96-yards and 2 touchdowns and Alex George completed 1 pass for 5-yards for the Bulldogs. Campbell caught 1 pass for a 39-yard touchdown, followed by Nate Jacobs with 2 for 33-yards, Dan Gay with 1 for a 15 yard touchdown, Matt Fritz with 1 for 5-yards, and Real with 1 for 4-yards, for the Bulldogs. Real returned a kickoff 82-yards for a touchdown and Tyler Welker had an interception for the Bulldogs. Ian Melhorn led the Golden Knights rushing attack with 139-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), followed by Mike Kraft with 56-yards, and Andy Seiple with 14-yards. Quarterback Kraft completed 13 passes for 117-yards, 5 for 39-yards to Melhorn (including a 4-yard touchdown), 4 for 35-yards to Joe Giandalia, 3 for 31-yards to Alex Seitz, and 1 for 12-yards to Seiple, for the Golden Knights.

The Eagles of Dover (6-4 overall, 4-2 league) defeated the Fighting Irish of York Catholic (4-6 overall, 2-4 league) 41-12. Vaughn Hebron led the Eagles rushing attack with 203-yards, including 4 touchdowns of 3, 13, 51 and 18-yards (He won the YAIAA rushing title with 1,394-yards for the season), followed by Dan Fahringer with 135-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown), Zach Fox with a 50-yard touchdown, Colt Zarilla with 23, Zack Bachynski with 5, Jeff Wasko with 4, and Rodney Brown with 1-yard. Quarterback Zarilla completed 5 passes for 36-yards, 2 for 15-yards to Fahringer, 2 for 14-yards to John Miller, and 1 for 7-yards to Hebron, for the Eagles. Nick Falci led the Fighting Irish rushing attack with 10-yards, followed by Chris Reagan with 9, and Matt Webb with minus 1-yard. Quarterback Reagan completed 14 passes for 222-yards and 2 touchdowns, 5 for 133-yards to John Full (including touchdowns of 53 and 16-yards), 5 for 61-yards to Seth Hake, and 4 for 28-yards to Sean Obermeier, for the Fighting Irish.

The Rams of Kennard-Dale (1-8 overall, 0-6 league) defeated the Blackhawks of Susquenita (0-10 overall, 0-6 Mid-Penn Colonial Division) 24-7 in independent action, giving them their first winning season since 1972. Duncan Leftridge led the Rams rushing attack with 90-yards (including a 47-yard touchdown), followed by Mike Chenoweth with 73, Doug McClean with 65 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Jordan Senkbeil with 55 (including a 53-yard touchdown), Nate Wilkinson with 21, and Zach Bacigalupa with no yards. Quarterback Leftridge completed 2 passes for 51-yards, touchdown passes of 37 and 14-yards to Senkbeil, for the Rams. Derec Sauve led the Blackhawks rushing attack with 55-yards (including a 11-yard touchdown), followed by Russell Hiddeman with 28, Shane Kemmy with 15, Nathan Ressler with 6, and Devan Wieland with 6-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown). Quarterback Sauve completed 6 passes for 61-yards 4 for 48-yards to Hiddeman, 1 for 7-yards to Jeff Martz, and 1 for 6-yards to

Anthony Boyer, for the Blackhawks. Ressler also recovered a fumble and returned it 36-yards for a touchdown for the Blackhawks.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division III action:

The Thunderbolts of Littlestown (6-4 overall, 5-1 league) defeated the Eagles of Bermudian Springs (4-6 overall, 3-3 league) 28-7. The number 8 seeded Thunderbolts will visit the number 1 seeded Shamrocks of Trinity on Friday night in the first round of the class AA District 3 Playoffs. Cory Beaver led the Thunderbolts rushing attack with 46-yards (including an 11-yard touchdown), followed by Tyler Fodor with 18 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Matt Koontz with minus 3, and Jerrod Reynolds with minus 6-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown). Quarterback Reynolds completed 12 passes for 271-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 108-yards to Koontz (including a 58-yard touchdown), 5 for 84-yards to Garrett Bill, 3 for 59-yards to Jordon Staub, 1 for 10-yards to Fodor, and 1 for 10-yards to Ryan Wickline, for the Thunderbolts. Garrett Bill had 3 interceptions and Jordon Rolon recovered a fumble for the Thunderbolts. Derek Mummert led the Eagles rushing attack with 72-yards, followed by Preston Green with 25, Adam Stroup with 11, Tyler Deputy with minus 10, and Allex Hartzell with minus 25-yards. Quarterback Deputy completed 5 passes for 60-yards and Jordan Selfe completed 1 pass for 2-yards for the Eagles. Clint Kramer caught 4 passes for 47-yards, Jacob Stimer caught 1 for 13-yards, and Stroup caught 1 for 2-yards for the Eagles. Mummert returned an interception 40-yards for a touchdown for the Eagles.

The Cannons of Biglerville (6-4 overall, 4-2 league) romped over the Nighthawks of Hanover (1-9 overall, 1-5 league) 43-14. Parker Showers led the Cannons rushing attack with 82-yards (including 2 touchdowns of 5-yards each), followed by Kyle Whitmoyer with 26 (including an 8-yard touchdown), Tyrel Taughinbaugh with 13, and Thomas McMaster with 7-yards. Quarterback Whitmoyer completed 7 passes for 120-yards and 2 touchdowns, 2 for 47-yards to Showers (including a 33-yard touchdown), 3 for 37-yards to Mike Wagner (including an 11-yard touchdown), 1 for 19-yards to Tommy Kranias, and 1 for 17-yards to Taughinbaugh, for the Cannons. Taughinbaugh returned a kickoff 81-yards for a touchdown and Nic Lieberum had 2 interceptions for the Cannons. Zach Wentz led the Nighthawks rushing attack with 82-yards, followed by Tyler Meckley with 65 (including a 3-yard touchdown), Chris Joseph with 25, Josh Livelsberger with 4, and Joe Null with minus 31-yards. Quarterback Livelsberger completed 6 passes for 66-yards and Chris Joseph completed 1 pass for 13-yards and a touchdown. Wolford caught 4 passes for 63-yards (including a 13-yard touchdown), followed by Tyler Sanders with 1 for 10-yards, Jon Osladil with 1 for 4-yards, and Wentz with 1 for 2-yards, for the Nighthawks.

The Knights of Fairfield (3-7 overall, 2-4 league) shutout the Spartans of York County Tech (1-9 overall, 0-6 league) 34-0. The number 7 seeded Knights will visit the number 2 seeded Steamrollers of Steelton-Highspire Friday in the first round of the class A District 3 Playoffs. Dustin Gebhart led the Knights rushing attack with 233-yards (including touchdowns of 4, 8 and 15-yards), followed by Corey Staples with 84, Derek McCleaf with 14, Thomas Myers with 10, Derek Smith with 8, Joshua Cornish with 7, and Aaron Sewell with 7-yards (including touchdowns of 3 and 4-yards). Quarterback Sewell completed 3 passes for 47-yards, 1 for 19-yards to Keith Housel, 1 for 19-yards to Travis Stambaugh, and 1 for 9-yards to Staples, for the Knights. Robert Cooley led the Spartans rushing attack with 20-yards, followed by Dejon

O'Conner with 7, Mike Pope with 4, Tyler Stonesifer with 4, Davon Talley with 2, and Kent Weibley with 2. Quarterback Weibley completed 2 passes for 17-yards, 1 for 11-yards to Anthony Green and 1 for 6-yards to Lee Yeager, for the Spartans.

Adams or York County Mid-Penn action:

The Polar Bears of Northern York (10-0 overall, 6-0 Mid-Penn Colonial Division) defeated the Greyhounds of Shippensburg (7-3 overall, 4-2 Mid-Penn Colonial Division) 35-21. The number 1 seeded Polar Bears will host the number 16 seeded Hawks of Hamburg Friday in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. Bubba Smith led the Polar Bears with 91-yards rushing (including a 4-yard touchdown), followed by Michael Davies with 84-yards (including an 8-yard touchdown), Edward Stephenson with 47, and Jordan Rutherford with no yards (including touchdowns of 1 and 3-yards). Quarterback Rutherford completed 9 passes for 182-yards and a touchdown, 4 for 95-yards to Ryan Aumiller (including a 32-yard touchdown), 2 for 31-yards to Robert Bleiler, 1 for 24-yards to Don Bell, 1 for 18-yards to Harrison Sanders, and 1 for 14-yards to Smith, for the Polar Bears. Ethan Naylor led the Greyhounds rushing attack with 121-yards (including touchdowns of 30 and 4-yards), followed by Vinny Secary with 44, Jermayne Webber with 33, and Craig Van Scyoc with minus 12-yards. Quarterback Van Scyoc completed 8 passes for 141-yards and a touchdown, 2 for 55-yards to Wayne Craig, 2 for 49-yards to James Wenger, 1 for a 29-yard touchdown to Loren Horst, 2 for 10-yards to Josh Karper, and 1 for minus 2-yards to Naylor, for the Greyhounds. Evan Lewis led the Warriors rushing attack with 74-yards, followed by Justin Jones with 70 (including a 1-yard touchdown), Cody Trail with 8, and Zach Sharrah with 2-yards. Quarterback Lewis completed 8 passes for 213-yards and 2 touchdowns, 2 for 88-yards to D. J. Cool, 2 for 88-yards to Zach Michael (including touchdowns of 42 and 46-yards), 3 for 24-yards to Storm Woerner, and 1 for 13-yards to Sean Manahan, for the Warriors. Evan Lewis kicked a 32-yard field goal and Zach Michael had an interception and 3 pass defenses for the Warriors. Jordan Rosario led the Flacons rushing attack with 39-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), followed by Nick Caruso with 11, Nick Atanasoff with 10, Derrek Thomas with 3, Mike Rissmiller with 1, and Jared Bausch with minus 7-yards. Quarterback Atanasoff completed 15 passes for 149-yards and a touchdown, 3 for 65-yards to Rissmiller (including a 38-yard touchdown), 5 for 21-yards to Bausch, 2 for 17-yards to Thomas, 2 for 15-yards to Rosario, 1 for 10-yards to Jeremy Hauck, and 1 for 10-yards to Billy McGee, for the Falcons. Quarterback Skylar Hunt completed 7 passes for 62-yards, 2 for 32-yards to Nick Liddell, 2 for 19-yards to Kyle Otstot, 1 for 7 to Rodriguez, 1 for 5 to Dan Klein, and 1 for minus 1-yard to Teed Wertz, for the Patriots. Christen kicked 2 field goals, for 42 and 22-yards, and an extra point, Klein intercepted a pass, Liddell recovered 2 fumbles, and Moore recovered a fumble for the Patriots. Pat Otey led the Trojans rushing attack with 31-yards, followed by Tyler Neal with 30, Erick Marinelli with minus 1, and Jake Campbell with minus 55-yards. Kyle Patrick kicked a 40-yard field goal, Boyer recovered a fumble, Nick Hastings had 3 sacks, and Otey and Bobby Ruth each had a sack for the Trojans.
