

District 3 Notes for York & Adams Counties – Week Eleven

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division I action:

The number 4 seeded Bearcats of William Penn of York (10-1 overall, 6-0 league) defeated the number 13 seeded Wildcats of Dallastown (6-5 overall, 5-1 league) 21-6 Friday night in the first round of the class AAAA District 3 Playoffs. The Bearcats will host the number 12 seeded Bulldogs of Wilson (8-3 overall, 5-2 Lancaster Lebanon League Section 1) in the next round of the playoffs. Mike Kinard returned the opening kickoff 68-yards and Brandon Walker scored a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage as the Bearcats came out smoking. Walker led the Bearcats rushing attack with 101-yards (including the 24-yard touchdown), followed by Kinard with 82-yards, Wilfredo Martinez with 25 (including a 13-yard touchdown), and Robert Richardson with 5-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown). Quarterback Jordan Davis completed 12 passes for 131-yards, 4 for 46-yards to Andre Callum, 2 for 41-yards to Richardson, 4 for 24-yards to Kinard, and 2 for 20-yards to Malik Generette, for the Bearcats. Kevin Frisby led the Wildcats rushing attack with 57-yards, followed by Andre Le with 38, Kole Kraut with 21, Matt Rae with 16, and Jon Heird with 1-yard. Quarterback Frisby completed 4 passes for 120-yards, 2 for 100-yards to Le (including a 95-yard touchdown), and 2 for 20-yards to Ben Kline, for the Wildcats.

The number 11 seeded Panthers of Central York (7-4 overall, 4-2 league) were defeated by the number 6 seeded Crusaders of Bishop McDevitt (9-2 overall, 7-2 Mid Penn Commonwealth Division) 31-7 Saturday afternoon in the class AAAA District 3 playoffs. The Crusaders will visit the number 3 seeded Mustangs of Governor Mifflin (10-1 overall, 6-0 Berks Inter-County League 1) in the next round of the playoffs. Mike Jones led the Crusaders rushing attack with 164-yards (including touchdowns of 11 and 1-yards), followed by Derrell Holland with 143-yards (including a 62-yard touchdown), Kyle Koncar with 25, and Jameel Poteat with 4-yards. Quarterback Koncar completed 8 passes for 132-yards and a touchdown, 1 for a 48-yard touchdown to Tyrell Harris, 3 for 45-yards to Julian Harrell, 2 for 28-yards to Jones, 1 for 8-yards to Salath Williams, and 1 for 3-yards to Mike Comasco, for the Crusaders. Comasco also kicked 4 extra points and a 42-yard field goal for the Crusaders. T. J. Shaffer led the Panthers rushing attack with 117-yards, followed by Blaine Liggins with 14, Parrish Fells with 7, Tyler Wilcox with minus 5, and Brandon Workinger with minus 27-yards. Quarterback Workinger completed 11 passes for 135-yards and a touchdown, 4 for 67-yards to Liggins, 3 for 43-yards to Ryan Wolf (including a 20-yard touchdown), 2 for 14-yards to Fells, 1 for 6-yards to Shaffer, and 1 for 5-yards to Kyle Baublitz, for the Panthers.

The number 15 seeded Lions of Red Lion (6-5 overall, 2-4 league) were defeated by the number 2 seeded Blue Streaks of Manheim Township (10-1 overall, 7-0 Lancaster Lebanon League Section 1) 27-7 Friday night in the first round of the class AAAA District 3 Playoffs. The Blue Streaks will host the number 10 seeded Rams of Central Dauphin (8-3 overall, 6-3 Mid-Penn Commonwealth Division) in the next round of the playoffs. Dan Wertz led the Blue Streaks rushing attack with 197-yards (including a 4-yard touchdown), followed by Nate Pagan with 114 (including an 80-yard touchdown), Nick Sizemore with 15, Doug Minnick with 3, Dan Kaufman with 0 (including a 12-yard touchdown), and Jon Yuko with minus 3-yards. Yuko completed 1

pass for 18-yards to Nate Pagan and Dan Wertz completed 1 pass for 6-yards to Pagan for the Blue Streaks. David Soldner kicked 2 field goals, for 29 and 30-yards, for the Blue Streaks. Steve Trimmer intercepted a Blue Streaks pass early in the game and returned it to the Blue Streaks 12-yard line, setting up a 1-yard touchdown plunge by Jake Hagan and the Lions led 7-0 at 7:58 in the first quarter. Unfortunately for them, that was all the scoring they would do. They were held to 17-yards rushing and 46-yards passing for the game. Brett Fishel led the Lions rushing attack with 8-yards, followed by Hagan with 6, Chris Liggitt with 3, Ethan Becker with 3-yards, and Joe Ross with minus 3-yards. Quarterback Becker completed 3 passes for 46-yards, 2 for 27-yards to Taylor Dolan and 1 for 19-yards to Todd Maciejewski, for the Lions.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division II action:

The number 5 seeded Bulldogs of West York (10-1 overall, 6-0 league) defeated the number 12 seeded Golden Mules of Solanco (7-4 overall, 6-1 Lancaster Lebanon League Section 2) 23-7 Friday night in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. The Bulldogs will visit the number 4 seeded Warriors of Gettysburg (10-1 overall, 6-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) in the next round of the playoffs. The Bulldogs defense forced 5 Golden Mules turnovers to stop many a drive. Brandon Real led the Bulldogs rushing attack with 93-yards (including touchdowns of 6 and 4-yards), followed by Dan Haverstock with 67 (including a 27-yard touchdown), and Jay Hess with 10-yards. Quarterback Haverstock completed 10 passes for 114-yards, 1 for 39-yards to Blake Campbell, 2 for 30-yards to Nate Jacobs, 3 for 26-yards to Hess, 1 for 10-yards to Blaine Fissel, 1 for 6-yards to Dan Gay, and 2 for 3-yards to Real, for the Bulldogs. Drew Shaffer kicked 2 extra points and a 25-yard field goal for the Bulldogs. Jordon Elvey led the Golden Mules rushing attack with 25-yards, followed by Brock Snider with 18 (including a 7-yard touchdown), Ben Miller with 13, Patrick Nieto with 10, Mike Brooks with 7, and B. J. Enck with minus 6-yards. Quarterback Miller completed 3 passes for 17-yards, 2 for 16-yards to Brooks and 1 for 1-yard to Dustin Collins, for the Golden Mules.

York-Adams Interscholastic Athletic Association (YAIAA) Division III action:

The number 6 seeded Squires of Delone Catholic (8-3 overall, 6-0 league) edged the number 3 seeded Crimson Tide of Columbia (8-3 overall, 5-2 Lancaster Lebanon League Section 3) 27-26 in overtime Friday night in the class AA District 3 playoffs. The Squires will visit the number 2 seeded Crusaders of Lancaster Catholic (9-2 overall, 6-1 Lancaster-Lebanon League Section 3) in the next round of the playoffs. A missed extra point attempt by each team in regulation time left the score tied at 20 and a missed extra point in overtime by the Crimson Tide resulted in the 1-point win by the Squires. Mike Kale led the Squires rushing attack with 109-yards, followed by Dustin Reed with 88 (including touchdowns of 18 and 6-yards), McNutt with 40 (including an 8-yard touchdown), Brayden Daigle with 14, and Noah Landi with minus 17-yards (including a 1-yard touchdown). Quarterback Landi completed 6 passes for 79-yards, 4 for 37-yards to Daigle and 2 for 42-yards to Kale, for the Squires. Miles Moore kicked 3 extra points for the Squires and a 2-point conversion attempt failed. Ben Guiles led the Crimson Tide rushing attack with 162-yards (including touchdowns of 3, 1 and 20-yards), followed by Colby Tuell with 5, Dakota Lightfoot with 3, and Mike Seibert with 0-yards. Quarterback Seibert completed 9 passes for 116-yards and a touchdown, 3 for 50-yards to Guiles, 2 for 22-yards to Yahya McIntyre, 2 for 20-yards to Garrett Mower, 1 for 17-yards to Tuell, and 1 for a 7-yard

touchdown to Don Thompson, for the Crimson Tide. Seibert connected on 2 of 4 extra point kicks for the Crimson Tide.

The number 8 seeded Thunderbolts of Littlestown (6-5 overall, 5-1 league) were defeated by the number 1 seeded Shamrocks of Trinity (11-0 overall, 7-0 Mid-Penn Capital Division) 36-6 on Friday night in the first round of the class AA District 3 Playoffs. The Shamrocks will host the number 5 seeded Spartans of Milton Hershey (8-3 overall, 5-2 Mid-Penn Capital Division) in the next round of the playoffs. Rod Trevino led the Shamrock rushing attack with 124-yards, followed by John Slifka with 97 (including a 9-yard touchdown), Christian Kuntz with 55 (including a 43-yard touchdown), Marino Magaro with 26, Ted Spinelli with 15 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Jim Murphy with 2, and Mike Tilley with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Spinelli completed 4 passes to Kuntz for 68-yards, including a 27-yard touchdown, for the Shamrocks. Murphy kicked 3 extra points and a 23-yard field goal, Kuntz, who intercepted 3 passes, returned an interception 43-yards for a touchdown, and Matt Brosious, Steve Kazor each intercepted a pass, and Bill Phillipy recovered a fumble for the Shamrocks. Corey Beaver led the Thunderbolts with 51-yards, followed by Tyler Fodor with 6, Thomas Senseney with 1, Matt Koontz with 0, Jon Clines with minus 1, and Jerrod Reynolds with minus 2-yards. Quarterback Reynolds completed 12 passes for 133-yards and a touchdown, 6 for 70-yards to Jordan Staub (including a 17-yard touchdown), 2 for 33-yards to Garrett Bill, 1 for 26-yards to Koontz, 1 for 7-yards to Beaver, 1 for 7-yards to Fodor, and 1 for 4-yards to Ryan Wickline, for the Thunderbolts

The number 7 seeded Knights of Fairfield (3-8 overall, 2-4 league were overwhelmed by the number 2 seeded Steamrollers of Steelton-Highspire (8-3 overall, 4-3 Mid-Penn Capital Division) 53-8 Friday in the first round of the class A District 3 Playoffs. The Steamrollers will host the Lions of Camp Hill (8-3 overall, 6-1 Mid-Penn Capital Division) in the next round of the playoffs. Jeff Davis intercepted 2 Knights passes and returned them for touchdowns of 40 and 35-yards and the Steamrollers were up 14-0 less than 2 minutes into the game. Shortly thereafter Jordan Smith returned a Knights punt 60-yards for a touchdown and the Steamrollers led 20-0 just over 4 minutes into the game. Jeremiah Young led the Steamrollers rushing attack with 103-yards (including a 5-yard touchdown), followed by Aaron Wilson with 80 (including a 30-yard touchdown), James Wilbern with 78, Gabe George with 17, Jordan Hill with 17 (including a 10-yard touchdown), Kyle Blockson with 10, Andre Campbell with 7 (including a 2-yard touchdown), Jermell Fleming with minus 1 (including a 4-yard touchdown), and Chris Chilton with minus of 11-yards. The Streamrollers did not complete a pass in the game, and only attempted one. Josh Comish led the Knights rushing attack with 41-yards, followed by Corey Staples with 16 (including a 6-yard touchdown), Derek McCleaf with 15, Travis Stambaugh with 8, Derek Smith with 7, Keifer Rogers with 4, and Aaron Sewell with minus 5-yards. Quarterback Sewell completed 1 pass for 15-yards to Keith Housel, for the Knights.

Adams or York County Mid-Penn action:

The number 1 seeded Polar Bears of Northern York (11-0 overall, 6-0 Mid-Penn Colonial Division) shutout the number 16 seeded Hawks of Hamburg (7-4 overall, 5-2 Berks Inter-County League 2) 35-0 Friday in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. The Polar Bears will host the number 9 seeded Blazers of Daniel Boone (8-3 overall, 3-3 Berks Inter-County

League 1) in the next round of the playoffs. Michael Davies led the Polar Bears rushing attack with 112-yards (including a 3-yard touchdown), followed by Bubba Smith with 82 (including a 4-yard touchdown), Robert James with 12, Don Bell with 11, Jordan Rutherford with 4, Eddie Stephenson with 3, and Dustin Miller with minus 4-yards. Quarterback Rutherford completed 8 passes for 106-yards and 3 touchdowns, 2 for 37-yards to Davies, 2 for 25-yards to Ryan Aumiller (including a 13-yard touchdown), 1 for a 20-yard touchdown to Robbie Bleiler, 2 for 12-yards to Bell (including an 8-yard touchdown), and 1 for 12-yards to Hank Sanders, for the Polar Bears. Marvin Cottrell led the Hawks rushing attack with 43-yards, followed by Nathan Shefter with 21, Jared Ruppert with 19, Zachary Koop with 17, and Jordan Ernst with minus 3-yards. Quarterback Ruppert completed 5 passes for 38-yards, 2 for 27-yards to Ernst, 1 for 11-yards to Brett Sanko, 1 for 0-yards to Koop, and 1 for 0-yards to Gregory Thomas, for the Hawks.

The number 3 seeded Patriots of Red Land (10-1 overall, 6-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) defeated the number 14 seeded Barons of Manheim Central (6-5 overall, 5-2 Lancaster Lebanon League Division 2) 16-6 Friday in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. The Patriots will host the number 6 seeded Trojans of Hershey (9-2 overall, 502 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) in the next round of the playoffs. Junior Rodriguez led the Patriots rushing attack with 111-yards (including), followed by Dan Yenger with 46, Kyle Ostot with 31, Scotty Acri with 19, Teed Wertz with 9, Skyler Hunt with 7, Nicco Faris with 5, and Aubrey Moore with a 2-yard touchdown. Quarterback Hunt completed 9 passes for 94-yards and a touchdown and Ostot completed 1 pass for 15-yards for the Patriots. Dan Klein caught 3 passes for 38-yards (including a 20-yard touchdown), followed by Ryan Schaeffer with 2 for 30, Wertz with 2 for 26, and Ostot with 3 for 15-yards, for the Patriots. Chad Christen kicked an extra point and a 36-yard field goal for the Patriots. Billy Beecher led the Barons rushing attack with 74-yards (including a 53-yard touchdown), followed by Alex Shenk with 45, Dan Trafford with 16, Scott Garber with 13, and Tony Ferrari with 12-yards. Quarterback Beecher completed 4 passes for 51-yards, 3 for 38-yards to Mike Stum and 1 for 13-yards to Travis Ebersole, for the Barons.

The number 4 seeded Warriors of Gettysburg (10-1 overall, 6-1 Mid-Penn Keystone Division) defeated the number 13 seeded Vikings of Northern Lebanon (7-4 overall, 4-3 Lancaster Lebanon League Division 3) 38-13 Friday in the first round of the class AAA District 3 Playoffs. The Warriors will host the number 5 seeded Bulldogs of West York in the next round of the playoffs. Evan Lewis led the Warriors rushing attack with 73-yards (including a 15-yard touchdown), followed by Justin Jones with 67 (including a 1-yard touchdown), and Cody Trail with 22-yards. Quarterback Lewis completed 14 passes for 247-yards and 3 touchdowns, 4 for 98-yards to Storm Woerner (including an 11-yard touchdown), 3 for 51-yards to Zach Michael (including a 4-yard touchdown), 2 for 39-yards to Jones (including an 18-yard touchdown), 3 for 36-yards to Sean Manahan, and 2 for 23-yards to Trail, for the Warriors. Lewis broke his own Hanover Area single season records for passing yards and touchdowns and now stands at 2107-yards passing and 24 touchdowns, with 108 completions on 159 attempts. Lewis also kicked 5 extra points and a 33-yard field goal for the Warriors. Travis Dresch led the Vikings rushing attack with 100-yards (including a 16-yard touchdown), followed by Jason Nolan with 86, and Matt Nolan with 56-yards. Quarterback Matt Nolan completed 2 passes for 16-yards to Dresch (including a 4-yard touchdown) for the Vikings.
