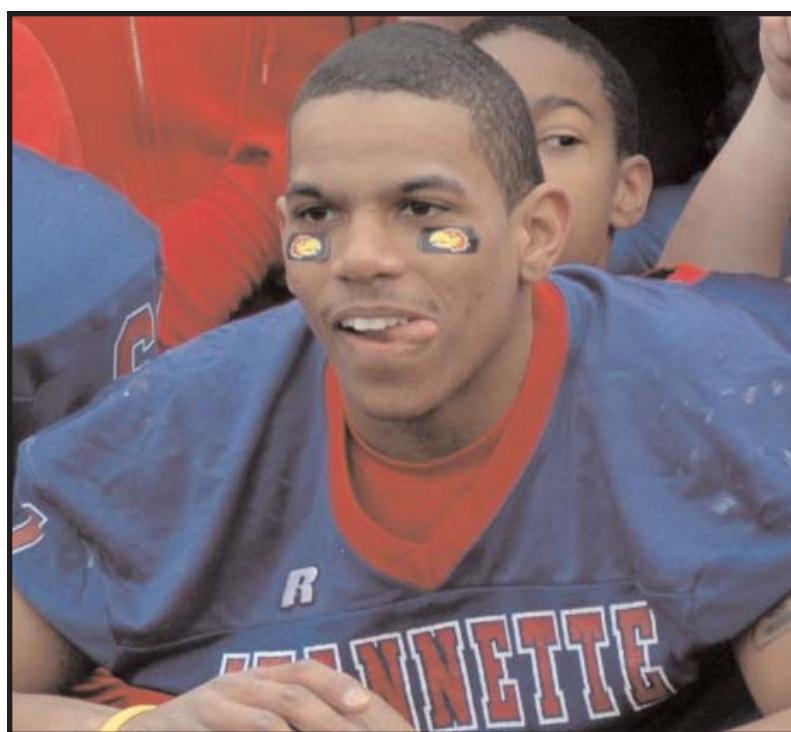
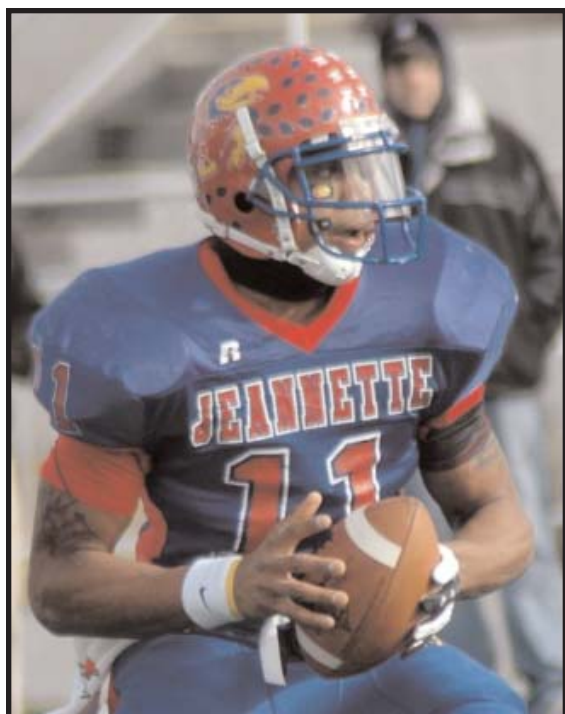


PFN's Pennsylvania Mister Football 2007

Selecting the **PFN MISTER FOOTBALL AWARD** in 2007 was truly a no-brainer. It was, and will be, one of the easiest decisions that we will ever have to make.

Why? It's plain and simple. Terrelle Pryor, arguably, is the best high school football player that the Keystone State has ever seen. He possesses the three S's that are rarely found in any high school football player. The traits are Size, Speed, and Savvy.

Pryor is listed at 6' 6", 220 pounds, runs (or should we say glides) like a deer, and has an uncanny football presence on the gridiron.

He is the first Pennsylvania high school football player to rush for over 4,000 yards and pass for over 4,000 in his career.

This past season, he rushed for 1,676 yards on 197 attempts. He completed 92 of 163 passes for 1,732 yards. He threw for 15 touchdowns and scored 29 times. On one of those touchdowns in the PIAA championship game, he was on the receiving end.

In this year's All-American Bowl, Pryor was named the Most Valuable Player, an honor that silenced his few critics that he played Class AA football against lesser competition. Put this kid in any class and he will excel. It's that simple!

He is considered to be the nation's number one recruit and not too many people are going to argue that after watching his more than stellar, and at times acrobatic, performances on the football field.
