

NTL Week 2 – Mary Raupers

Troy 42 – Sayre 0

Matt May scored twice and Chance Wright scored three times to lead Troy to a win over Sayre. May rushed for 148 yards and Wright for 104. Troy QB Devon Weed was 8 for 12 with 126 yards, 2 td's and 1 interception by Sayre's Mike Cooley. Troy's Brad Morgan also snatched an interception.

North Penn 28 – Wyalusing 7

The Panthers rolled up 284 yards of total offense on the night, 268 of which came on the ground as they scored 21 second-half points. Levi Weiskopff led all rushers with 143 yards on 23 carries. Riley Bowen added 56 yards rushing on 18 carries for the Panthers with two scores and Eli Morgan was 1-of-3 passing for 16 yards on the day. Levi Weiskopff hauled in the lone completion. Bryn Duffield led the Rams rushing attack with 44 yards on seven carries. Darron Mahoney was 11-of-21 passing for 131 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions.

Muncy 21 – Towanda 13

Muncy's Eric Lehman posted two interceptions, including one with less than :30 remaining in the game to seal a 21-13 Indians' win Friday night, spoiling the Towanda Black Knights' home opener. Mike Ditzler led the Indians' ground game with 70 yards on 13 carries with a score. Kyle Hill was 7-of-18 passing for 85 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Lehman hauled in three passes for 52 yards and two scores. Jake Lamphere led the Black Knights in rushing with 126 yards on just eight carries while Adam Harris chipped in with 64 yards on 14 carries and a score. Jake Lamphere was 5-of-21 passing for 48 yards with no touchdowns and four interceptions. R.J. Baker led the Towanda receiving corps with four catches for 40 yards. In addition to Eric Lehman's two interceptions, Richner and Mike Ditzler each recorded one. Adam Harris and Eric Potter had interceptions for the Black Knights.

Canton 17 – Wellsboro 7

Lucas Bailey led the Warriors in rushing on the day with 66 yards on 15 carries and a score while Corey Fromille added 42 yards on eight carries and Nick Petrowski chipped in with 29 yards on nine carries. Holmes was 3-of-11 passing for 72 yards with two interceptions. Corey Fromille hauled in two of those passes for 64 yards and Bailey had the other reception for eight yards. Tom led the Green Hornets in rushing with 15 yards on eight carries. Tim Shaw was 9-of-25 passing for 72 yards with two interceptions. Colton Acorn had two receptions for 24 yards and Clark added three receptions for 27 yards.

Loyalsock 43 - South Williamsport 28

Loyalsock scored on six of its first seven possessions, put up 29 second-quarter points. Jamil McGee ran for 100 yards and two touchdowns. Loyalsock Pat Carey was 14 of 19 for 221 yards and threw all three of his touchdown passes to Will Kelly in the second and

third quarters. The combination of McGee's big-play running and Carey's effective passing helped Loysock score five first-half touchdowns in just 8:30.
